From the Rectory


What a difference three weeks makes! Three weeks ago my focus might have been on the services and events marking Easter and perhaps the 75th anniversary of VE Day.

But now all is completely changed. The coronavirus emergency and the 'social distancing' measures that have been introduced have made a massive impact on all of us. For the church this means both that public church services have been suspended and, following the Prime Minister's announcement on Monday 23rd March that all the churches in the Camelot Group have been closed.

Last week it was still possible to hold weddings although these had to be limited to five people. We did have a wedding of this kind at St Michael's on Friday 20th March. As I thought about this the words which we so often hear at weddings went through my mind 'faith, hope, and love abide...and the greatest of these is love.' (1 Corinthians 13: 13). Although the impact of the emergency will be different for each of us, I wondered how these words might help us.

First of all faith. In times like this it is entirely understandable and natural to be afraid. But decisions based on fear tend not to be the best ones. For instance, how wise or loving is it to stockpile provisions?

Faith counters fear. At various critical points in His ministry Jesus tells the disciples not to be afraid. We need to build up our confidence, trust and faith in these times. You can find a selection (by no means exhaustive) of resources for this in the later 'Faith' section.



And then hope. I have been tempted to tell people 'Oh, Easter has been cancelled this year.' And then I realise that this is a silly remark. How could Easter be cancelled when it is based on the Resurrection of Jesus Christ which is beyond the reach of any virus? No, rather we will celebrate Easter in new and different ways. There is a starting suggestion for this in the later 'Hope' section along with many ideas for prayer to draw on the hope God gives us.

Which brings us on to love. I have been truly humbled to come across so many expressions of love and concern in these times. One has been the formation of a new network of community volunteers across the Camelot villages focussed on the delivery of food and medicine to those who cannot shop for themselves. There are further details in the later 'Love' section. But all of us perhaps could consider a simple phone call to someone we know who is isolated and in need. It could make such a difference.

We have been shaken to our foundations. But when we are shaken what is essential remains. Faith, hope, and love abide and the greatest of these is love.

Weddings, Baptisms/Christenings and Funerals

The churches can no longer be used for any service.

Therefore there can be no weddings as long as these emergency restrictions are in place. There can be no baptisms/ christenings in church although emergency baptisms (when a child's life is in danger) can take place in hospital or at home, subject to strict hygiene precautions and physical distancing.

Funerals can only happen at the Crematorium or by the graveside and only immediate family members (spouse or partner, parents and children) can attend. Those over the age of 70 or with underlying health problems are discouraged from attending and there should be physical distancing. Crematoria will also have their own rules and may allow only the funeral director and hearse bearers in the building itself, i.e. no ministers or family in the building. As the position is very fluid at the moment it will be necessary to check at the time with crematoria such as Yeovil and Mendip what their current rules are.

Where possible any preliminary meetings for funerals should be undertaken by telephone or Skype and it is recommended that there should be no social gatherings after these services.

For weddings, it is not possible to call banns while public worship services are suspended. Accordingly, the normal legal preliminary will now be Bishop's Common Licence.

Further and fuller information on these matters can be found on the Church of England website (details as above) which is kept regularly updated.

Church Meetings

We are asked only to hold essential meetings. While Holton Annual Meeting has already been held those of the other parishes have not. Accordingly these are being postponed and will be rearranged in due course. The Bishops have made legal changes to enable such meetings to take place at any time up until the end of October. Their actual date will depend on the relaxing of the social distancing measures.

Parishes Office

The Parish Office will only be staffed and open if this is absolutely necessary. We

recommend in the first instance not going to the Parish Office but contacting Rob Sage by email or telephone if you need administrative help at this time. Please use the e-mail at the bottom of page 2. If the Office is unmanned, please ring 01749 850934 during office hours.

Churches

As from Tuesday 24th March and following the Prime Minister's announcement the Camelot churches have been closed and will remain so until the government advises us that these restrictions have been lifted.

Pastoral Visits

Please be aware that under the new restrictions that pastoral visits can only be undertaken when essential and where phone contact is not enough. In cases where people are self-isolating there are even more stringent requirements. Please be aware that Yeovil District Hospital has indicated that the only visitors allowed are immediate family members or carers. This means that clergy cannot at the moment undertake visits to this hospital. Ministry in this respect will be undertaken by the hospital chaplain.

CAMELOT FAITH

Consult the diocesan website for information concerning streaming of church services. It currently has a link to the live streaming of services at St John's Yeovil but no doubt more links will be added as the current suspension of services continues.

From the Bishop

As we reflect on the Easter story this month I'm reminded of the sense of 'touch'. It was Passover, a religious festival, and as Jesus was laid in the tomb, Sabbath was upon them. So the usual burial rites were not attended to by the women who were closest to Jesus. It would have been improper to touch the dead body. Hence their early arrival on that resurrection morning.

In the following days, in attempts to dispel disbelief, Jesus' followers had opportunity to not only talk with him, eat with him, but also touch him as he came among them. Thomas's doubt was he dispelled as was invited to place his hand in the wounds of Christ.'

As I write this we are **JOI** wondering what Covid 19 might have in store for us in the UK. We hear now that Italy has taken drastic action in hoping to contain the virus. I don't know what further precautions we in the UK may have taken by the time you read this.

Currently we are all taking greater care with our personal hygiene in washing hands and ensuring we use and bin tissues. Today, along with the rest of the Church of England, we in Bath and Wells, have recommended that we only receive bread or wafers at Holy Communion and refrain from touching, through

blessing, sharing the Peace or prayer through laying on of hands.

There will be various responses to the concerns raised by the Government and the media.

Some may feel anxiety or fear about the nature of the virus whilst others may wonder if the emergency planning appears overreactive. Our response as a Church must be that we do what we can to ensure we stay safe by taking all precautions recommended.

And that we do all we can to reassure people who may feel vulnerable and worried by staying calm and showing compassion and care for all.

But how do we express such care? I've realised that touch plays quite an important part in showing we care for someone. When I was training as a nurse for a brief period many years ago, I recall being shown some research on touch. It was an eyeopener! Even the briefest of touches can cause people to feel better, cared for and happier. But the presence of Coronavirus means that we are having to withdraw touch to prevent the possibility of infection. So how might we try to replace touch with other signals of our care and value? What might that look like?

As folk may find themselves 'selfisolating' due to potential symptoms of the virus we have the opportunity to find new ways to show our care. Phone calls and cards, food deliveries, creative use of social media and streaming of worship services may all be ways to stay in touch and help people to know they are not alone. Rather finding than ourselves paralysed by the situation let us discover how we can create new opportunities strengthen to our relationships and communities.

May our actions be the reassuring, life-affirming 'touch' of the risen Christ this Easter!

Curriculum!

For anyone involved in schools, and indeed for those that are not – curriculum is easily recognisable as the buzz word in academia this year, however in my opinion nothing much has changed in what is expected from schools, other than a small organisation called Ofsted gaining a new interest.



The 2014 National Curriculum has always had a broad scope and in every school I have worked in, teachers and leaders have understood that for children to be good learners they have to be motivated, excited, engaged and invested. This only happens when the curriculum is broad and balanced (to borrow another frequently used 'new' phrase!)

One of the areas I am keen to develop further at North Cadbury is the provision of language skills for our Key Stage 2 children, and after much consideration and some consultation with local schools we have embarked upon the option of Latin. The Department for Education included Latin in the 2014 National Curriculum, reasoning that classical languages provide the foundation for learning modern foreign languages and for reading comprehension. Another study, the Iris Project, states that: As Latin is the root of English and many other languages, it is a valuable key to understanding and learning these, and it is a fun and fascinating subject for all children.

In my opinion, Latin helps children make connections between Latin and English grammar and vocabulary, and can help them unlock English, and understand common concepts and phrases such as 'et cetera' and 'Achilles' heel'.



Our Latin classes have started with shield making and Roman drills, and as I'm sure you can see the children are already invested and engaged.

North Cadbury and Yarlington Parish Council Neighbourhood Plan – the progress so far

Progress in producing a Neighbourhood Plan for the parish is continuing apace. The group working on this project have just finished the household survey for parish residents. A total of 58% of you returned your surveys, which is very high and shows your concern for the future of the parish. We are in the process of analysing the survey and will shortly publish detailed results on the website (see: northcadburyneighbourhoodplan).

The next part of information gathering is to look at employment, green spaces and facilities in the parish. This data is being gathered by interviews and from your survey entries.

The data will be used together with a housing needs assessment to try and establish what development is needed in the parish. The housing needs assessment is being done professionally and is based on population statistics, projected changes in household size and numbers, affordability, known employment in the area, population statistics and a whole raft of other information.

There will be development in the parish (whether or not we have a plan) and the purpose of the neighbourhood plan is to influence where and what is built to keep the essential character of the area. No development is not an option.

This is now the time for residents and local landowners to put forward for consideration sites that they own and would like considered for possible development. The best sites, that are supported by the community, would be included in the final parish neighbourhood plan. At present the number of dwellings that will be built in this parish is undecided. but could be up to 60 dwellings in a 15-20 vears period. Affordable and self-build housing is likely to be needed as well as possibly employment land and some for community facilities. At this stage the working group will consider all types and sizes of sites, including conversions and infill sites. Any sites for housing should be well related to an existing settlement (i.e. North Cadbury, Galhampton, Woolston or Yarlington). Feedback from local residents suggests that small sites that could be designed in keeping with the local character are likely to be supported.

The next stages of this work towards the Neighbourhood Plan will be a consultation on the site options which we hope to start by the summer.




