From the Rectory

There have been many different phases to the coronavirus emergency. Perhaps it has all dragged on much longer than anyone expected at the beginning. Indeed at the moment there is no clear end in sight when restrictions will end and life 'goes back to normal.'

At the beginning of the crisis there was a wonderful outpouring of community spirit and the desire to help others. But as time has drawn on we find the extent and depth of our generosity and love for one another being tested.

So as life opens up again we find different attitudes emerging. Some just want to get on with life again and struggle to see the purpose of all these restrictions. While others rather than wanting the pace of return to everyday life to speed up fear that perhaps the existing precautions do not go far enough.

We can find it difficult to respond to someone whose views are very different from our own. It is a challenge to our capacity to love. Thinking about this, I found that the wisdom contained in the bible passages set for this Sunday was very timely and relevant.

In the gospel we find Peter wanting to protect his friend Jesus from the pain and suffering that He was about to face. But Jesus tells Peter that there is a difference between a divine



and a purely human perspective on life. The divine perspective is one shaped by Jesus' Cross and Resurrection. Even though this way does involve great hardship and suffering it is ultimately one of supreme and enduring love.


Our other reading from ch.12 of Paul's letter to the Romans gives us some more detailed guidance about Christ's way of love. How do we respond to our enemies? Our enemies may simply be those we disagree with or even those who oppose and frustrate our plans.


First of all, the language we use matters. We are to bless rather than to curse. So we need to find language which affirms the other person even when we disagree with him or her.

And then our natural response is to want to defend our position and even to attack and to hit back at the other person. However, when we follow Christ's way of love we will not follow these natural responses. Rather than seeking to get even with other people we will actively meet the needs of our enemies and leave the question of vengeance up to God.

And to do this we need to be able to stand in the shoes of other people and to see life from their perspective. We rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep.

So yes, it may be that those natural reserves of love and community which were so evident in the early part of this emergency are in danger of running out. However, we can still draw on God's limitless reserves of love. Yes, at times this will mean going against our natural instincts. But it will also enable us to live peacefully with everyone even when we disagree with them. And surely that is a goal worth having at this time.

Compton Pauncefoot Church is open from 9.30am to 10.30am on Sunday September 6^{th} .


Galhampton Church is open from 4.00pm to 5.00pm on Wednesdays followed by Celtic Worship with Revd Alison Parris at 7.00pm.



From the Bishop

I am writing this whilst receiving treatment in hospital, although by the time you read this, I hope that I may be back home having completed my first course of chemotherapy. The first thing I want to say, and I am sure this is echoed by so many, is what wonderful treatment and care I have from received everyone in the hospital. Their kindness, concern and professionalism beyond are words.

What is an unusual experience for me however, is that I have not been allowed to leave my room and the doors and windows have been kept firmly shut. Looking out of my window and craning my neck upwards I am just able to get a glimpse of the sky outside. Without that I would not know whether it was sunny or cloudy or raining

outside. Not that I am in any way complaining. I am safe and receiving the best care imaginable. It is also important whatever may happen to keep a sense of proportion. I vividly recall hearing Terry Waite speak when he came to the Diocese on one occasion. It is unimaginable what he went through in those 1763 days in Beirut – the first four years of which were spent in solitary confinement, blindfolded, in a basement room with no windows, with no books or papers, chained to a radiator and sleeping on the floor. His courage and faith are



remarkable and have inspired so many people since. I remember him once being interviewed and being asked what the happiest moment of his life was, one that he would

cherish forever. He replied: 'When my blindfold was taken off during my release in November 1991. I'd been in the dark – in a basement or blindfolded - for years. For the first time in five years I saw the sky, the grass, the colours, and I felt the wind on my face.'

Terry Waite is also very clear about how the prayers of so many others supported him through those years. As I write I am also very aware of all the prayers that have and are being said for me. That is both humbling and encouraging and once I am getting out and about again, I look forward to being able to thank you personally.

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

The following topics were among matters discussed at the remote meeting of North Cadbury and Yarlington PC Meeting held on 22nd July 2020.

Reports from County and District Councillors

<u>C.Cllr Lewis</u> reported that Somerset County Council's (SCC) proposal for a Unitary Authority was gathering pace with both County and District Councils. The proposal would be considered at the next full meeting of SCC on 29th July 2020 prior to submission to the Secretary of State. Cllr Lewis gave an update on the dualling of the A303 from Sparkford to Ilchester. He reported that the Secretary of State is minded to refuse this application subject to further information or evidence from the Applicant, Highways England (HE), on a number of specific issues. HE has until 18th August 2020 to respond. The new deadline for a decision is now 20th November 2020.

Cllr Lewis reported that work to mitigate the effect of Covid 19 continued to ensure Somerset remained a relatively safe place and the prognosis was reasonably good at this stage. He considered the figures for the County were skewed due to figures from the Royal United Hospitals Bath as the hospital also provides healthcare to the population in Wiltshire and South Gloucestershire.

<u>D.Cllr Messenger</u> reported that Simon Fox recently left the Council and would be replaced as Lead Planning Officer by Stephen Baimbridge on a short term agreement. He also reported that grants were available from South Somerset District Council (SSDC) to help small businesses affected by Covid 19.

North Cadbury and Yarlington Neighbourhood Plan Working Group (NPWG)

Cllr Keys-Toyer gave the following report on behalf of the NPWG, which was brief as they were still working on the areas last reported:

Call for Sites: The infrastructure and environment consultancy company AECOM who have been commissioned to undertake site assessments, have completed the site visits and will be reporting back to the Working Group for further consultation. We plan to publish details of the sites within the next month.

Heritage/Design guidance: Cllr Keys-Toyer had been round the Joint Parishes with Kim Sankey, the architect commissioned to produce the Heritage Report. There will be further consultation on this before completion in early autumn.

Neighbourhood Plan Draft: Work continues on this.

NP Website: Residents can sign up on the website for a NP newsletter. The WG would also publicise the sites identified in the 'Call for Sites, via the newsletter, website, Galhampton Private Group Village Facebook page and a message would be sent via Nextdoor directing residents to the sites on the website.

Highways and Rights of Way

<u>Highways</u>. Cllr Rundle reported that a blocked culvert in Sandbrook Lane had been cleared. John Nicholson, SCC Highways Engineer informed him that, despite having the workforce to carry out highway repairs, as there was a shortage of tarmacadam they were unable to carry out the work.

<u>ROW</u>. Cllr Vaughan was pleased to report that the parish footpaths were in very good condition and positive feedback had been received. Cllr Vaughan reported that the Parish Paths Liaison Officer (PPLO), Mrs S Fone, had approached Emily Estate to ask for a donation towards four noticeboards to display ROW maps in the parishes. C.Cllr Lewis advised that the circular walk project could be eligible for match funding from the SCC Community Grant Fund and that District Councillors may also be able to match fund by 'payment in kind'. Cllr Vaughan hoped that the project would be complete for summer 2021. Following a brief discussion regarding the issues with Restricted Byway WN 19/105, it was proposed that it would be beneficial to arrange an on-site meeting with Cllr Vaughan, E Wynn, J Longman, R Rundle and the PPLO.

The wearing of face coverings is mandatory inside the church, unless you have a specific exemption. The officiant and anyone else speaking in public (for instance, doing a reading) are allowed to remove their face covering in order to improve their audibility, but not while distributing Communion (which is not part of a Sunday Worship service only a Communion service).

For Sunday Worship, service sheets are produced which are not reusable for a subsequent service. Please take these service sheets away with you.

We are not at this stage of the easing of restrictions permitted to have congregational singing. We may use prerecorded music or hymns and you can follow the words on your service sheet.

The collection plate cannot be shared round during the service but will be placed by the door for use on the way out. Please


