From the Rectory

As we enter into autumn a new season of uncertainty is around. Plenty of new restrictions to think about, what about the rule of six and what exceptions to the rule are there? How many are now allowed at weddings and is it the same for funerals?

Just to give some brief and immediate answers to those questions. Public worship is an exception to the rule of six and so we continue to hold public worship services in the Camelot Group following the easing of lockdown and the completion of the necessary safety measures. And the maximum number allowed at weddings is now 15 while for funerals it remains at 30.

But by the time you read this all may have changed again. And though we may understand the difficulties of the need to balance the considerations of health with the economy these seemingly constant changes are still difficult to absorb.

So in times of uncertainty what can we do? One thing we can do is to look outwards towards the needs of other people so that we do not become preoccupied with our own concerns. The weather on Sundays has recently been kind to us and this has enabled us to have two outdoor Harvest services at Maperton and North Cheriton. And though we could only listen to rather than sing the traditional harvest hymns the



services still gave us an opportunity for a fresh approach, perhaps more interactive than normal.

And Harvest this year also had a particular focus on the work of our local foodbanks, especially the Lord's Larder in Yeovil. For we reminded of the immense economic impact of the coronavirus emergency in terms of jobs which have already been and will be lost and the need to support those who struggle with the necessities of life. We can of course support our foodbanks not simply through one off gifts at Harvest but through ongoing donations both of food and finance. National charities such as the Trussell Trust can also give us further ideas of how we might help maybe through volunteering or supporting campaigns targeted at addressing the root causes of why we need foodbanks at all.

And when times are uncertain we can also look upwards to God who is the centre of our faith. The Psalms contain many different images which describe the security that God



provides. Many of us will have found comfort in the words of Psalm 91 which describes God as a shelter, a refuge and a fortress. And inspired by Psalm 46, Martin Luther wrote the hymn 'A mighty fortress is our God.'

So, yes, times are uncertain and we do not know what lies ahead of us.

But that makes it even more important to hold the Christian imperatives of loving God and loving our neighbours at the centre of our vision.

You can't always trust your feelings

We all know well-intentioned people, who, when you ask them to do something, you're not sure they will follow through. As nice as they are, they're unreliable.

Your feelings are like that; much of the time you can't count on them because they're not attuned to what's best for vou. They're more interested in having their own way. For example, our feelings can get us excited about going shopping when we don't have the money to spend. They entice us to eat cheesecake when we're trying to avoid extra calories. They lead us to stay up late at night working or watching TV, when we know we need to get up early the next day. In short, our feelings are fickle. They change like the wind. Yet it's amazing how much power we give them in our lives.

As believers, we have something wiser and more dependable to rely on than our feelings, and that's the Word of God. When we feel strongly about something, it's not always easy to determine whether or not we're in agreement with God about it.

Jeremiah tells us, 'The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows...it? But I, the Lord, search all hearts and examine secret motives' (Jeremiah 17: 9-10 NLT).

And He does it through His Word, which 'is sharper than any two-edged sword...exposing...sifting...analysing and judging the very thoughts and purposes of the heart' (Hebrews 4: 12 AMPC). Here's the score: if you're truly interested in rising above your feelings, you'll let the Word of God be the determining factor in all your decisions.

Interview - Faith and Farming



Farmer Rob Walrond is the Diocese's rural affairs adviser and Churchwarden for St John the Baptist, Pitney.

How does faith and farming connect for you?

Around 30 years ago my faith reignited and I gained a greater understanding of creation and my place in it. I came to acknowledge that the success or failure of my business wasn't a reflection on how good a person I was or how successful I was.

Why do you farm organically?

As my respect for creation grew I felt my role as a steward of creation changed. It was not about what I could get out of the land but more about how I could work with the land.

Does your faith help you with farming?

I still get mad when it rains just before harvest or if I am up to my knees in

mud, but my faith helps me look at things with a wider perspective.

Has the pandemic created any particular problems for farmers?

Most have coped really well, but with so few social opportunities the closure of markets and agricultural shows has had an impact. Farmers are used to working in isolation, but we all need social contact.

Do you think people's view of farmers has changed?

One farmer said, "We've gone from being an unwanted nuisance to being key workers." If we can get a greater appreciation of our food, the work that goes into producing it and the provision and generosity from God in providing the harvest, that would one of the good things that comes out of Covid.














Honey, honey!

If your grannie gave you honey when you had a cold, she was right.

Research published in The British Medical Journal has found that honey is especially good for treating upper respiratory tract infections (URTIs) such as the common cold.

Honey has anti-microbial and anti-inflammatory properties. These do better at soothing your cough and sniffles than any of the over-the-counter remedies. In fact, URTI sufferers who were given honey suffered their symptoms for up to two days LESS than those who did not use honey.

All good news, especially as honey is cheap, readily available, and has virtually no side effects.

Average debt fell by £2,000 during lockdown

Covid-19 has brought one good thing to some of us: the average amount of personal debt has reduced by nearly £2,000, according to a recent study by Experian. It recently stood at £9,681 (without mortgage), as opposed to £11,615 (without mortgage) in March.

As a spokesman for the credit-checking agency explained: "For some people, a reduction in spending on living costs and commuting have enabled the repayment of existing borrowing." And he urged that as the UK returns to something like normal, people should try and continue with the good financial habits picked up during lockdown.

But Dame Gillian Guy, chief executive of Citizen's Advice, said that while some people have been able to pay off some of their debts in the pandemic, many others have not. Instead, they "are behind on

essential bills, building up arrears they may struggle to ever pay back."

We love milk, but from where?

Dairy cows have serious competition these days: a third of young people are now opting for vegan milk instead. Recent data from the global market research firm, Mintel, has found that 23 per cent of Britons now use plant-based milk. It has become most popular among the 16 to 24-year-olds.

Many millennials have switched to soya milk because of environmental concerns, but the Sustainable Food Trust has recently warned that vegan milk could actually be far more harmful to the environment. They say that grass-fed dairy milk poses less of a threat to the Amazon and other rainforests than many soya products do.

Beauty ranges left on the shelves

Covid-19 has even affected make-up routines. In many cases, people simply haven't bothered.

The lack of demand for foundation, lipstick, eye makeup and hair-dye has been so great in recent months that 350 products have been pulled from supermarket shelves. Research from Edge by Ascential, the ecommerce consultancy, found that overall, there was a 60 per cent drop in sales.

Claire James, an analyst for IRI Insights, the retail experts, said that social distancing measures have meant that cautious shoppers no longer browse health and beauty aisles. "It will be interesting to see if routines will remain simpler as lockdown eases and people return to the office."

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

The following topics were among matters discussed at the remote meeting of North Cadbury and Yarlington PC Meeting held on 22nd September 2020.

Reports from County and District Councillors

<u>D.Cllr Messenger</u> reported that the plan by Somerset's four district councils for two new unitary authorities in Somerset had been described in the press and at a Castle Cary Town Council meeting as a "U-turn". This was complete fabrication, with 84% D.Cllrs voting in favour of the District Councils' business case 'Stronger Somerset' for two new councils in Somerset as twin authorities, having always been opposed to Somerset County Council's (SCC) proposal for a single unitary authority 'One Somerset'.

D.Cllr Messenger reported that South Somerset District Council (SSDC) will hold their 'Great Parish Tree Giveaway' scheme again in autumn and asked for parishes to consider where additional trees could be planted. Cllr Montgomery raised the issue of ash die-back, which was worsening. He asked if SSDC and SCC had considered the implications ash-die back could have on highways, along which ash trees were predominantly planted. Ash trees were notoriously difficult to work on and highways may need to be closed to carry out the work. He asked if parish and town councils could be kept up to date with any possible plans of action as the disease could potentially be as catastrophic as Dutch elm disease over the next few years.

<u>C.Cllr. Lewis</u> expressed the view that the Secretary of State is likely to rule that a unitary authority for Somerset should be implemented sooner rather than later. An election for SCC is due to take place in May 2021, however, it would seem logical that this would not take place and that a "shadow" unitary authority would be created in May 2021. The actual elections for the unitary authority would then take place in May 2022 when SCC and SSDC would be disbanded.

C.Cllr Lewis reported that Covid-19 was increasing in certain areas of the country, but not to such a great extent in Somerset. Both district and county councils were working together to try to ensure Somerset remained as safe as possible during the pandemic, with schools being a priority.

The RoW has had to be closed as it is now in too dangerous a state for pedestrians and horses due to motorised vehicles using it illegally.

SCC £1m Climate Emergency Community Fund.

Somerset Wildlife Trust (SWT) and Somerset Climate Action Network are asking Town and Parish Councils in Somerset to support and register as interested parties in their joint application for £75,000 from the fund.

Mr Marcus Gilbert, 'Environment Champion' for North Cadbury, was present remotely to put forward his proposal for a Village/Parish Woodland. Councillors agreed unanimously not to support the SWT on this occasion in the event the parish wished to apply to the Fund and the provision of Parish Woodlands would be on the agenda for consideration at the next meeting.




