From the Rectory

I understand that the word 'unprecedented' has been overused this year. On the other hand, I am tired of looking for variations on the word 'unprecedented'. So, yes, we are living in both unprecedented and unforeseen times.

And yet if I think about 'unprecedented' a bit further in the context of Christmas maybe I am not so sure about this word. Yes, we live under restrictions and yet the world into which lesus Christ was born was also one of many restrictions. Government orders were issued which resulted in numbers of people being forced to move across the country for the purposes of taking a census. And it was a dangerous world, too, as Herod's plot to kill the new born Messiah resulted not simply in a terrible massacre but in Joseph, Mary and the baby Jesus being forced into exile in a foreign country, Egypt.

And quite apart from these restrictions what about the restrictions which Jesus voluntarily took upon Himself as He the Son of God took on human flesh with all its vulnerability?

So we all have to live with the different restrictions of Tiers 1,2 and 3 and so on. How are we going to find a way through the Christmas period? What is the right balance to strike?

We may well feel ourselves baffled by all the regulations with which we have to deal and their seemingly ever-changing nature. And I do not think that there is just one way of finding the right balance between keeping ourselves and others safe and celebrating Christmas with our family and with others in church.



All of our circumstances are different and so what may be the right choice for you may not be the right choice for me. But as a guide to the way we make our decisions perhaps it will be helpful to remember Jesus' response when faced with the multiplicity of religious rules and regulations in His world. A scribe asked Him which was the most commandment. Jesus' reply was clear and straightforward. We need to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and to love our neighbour as ourselves. I do not think we will go far wrong if we seek these principles as our guide on what we do over this Christmas period.

Later in this edition of Excalibur you will find set out a schedule of services over the Christmas period (pages 16 & 17) with an accompanying explanation (pages 7 & 8). We have tried to use the full spectrum of opportunities that are available to us and so in addition to any services in church we are offering both outdoor services as well as livestreamed and recorded services. We hope that in all of this you will be able to find something that meets your spiritual needs over this Christmas period.



Making decisions on Christmas Services

The options that were available to us in providing Christmas services were (a) indoors, (b) outdoors, (c) livestreamed, and (d) recorded. Each of these various options are commented on below. We also needed to take account of the number of officiants available to lead Christmas services. This meant, for instance, that it was not possible to provide a Christmas Day service for Blackford. However, Blackford and Galhampton which do not have Christmas Day services do have services on both Christmas Eve and the 27th Sunday following Christmas. December.

It is not possible to cover all eventualities but given the circumstances under which we are operating we have tried in our process of decision making to be as inclusive as we can so that as many people as possible can enjoy church Christmas celebrations in one form or another.

(a) Indoor services

In other years, this is how we have held Christmas services. However, this year indoor services have presented new challenges which principally relate to the reduced socially distanced capacity of the church.

It has been necessary for churchwardens and others to determine how many people may safely be accommodated in their church and to weigh this against their anticipated likely attendance. For the purpose of knowing what their likely attendance might be they may have communicated with their potential congregations by email or letter.

Another consideration for indoor services is that the congregation is not allowed to sing although an organist can play and a small socially distanced choir can sing.

(b) Outdoor services

Although some churches have decided to go ahead with indoor services on a socially distanced basis others have decided that an outdoor service represents a better alternative.

This is likely to result in an increased overall capacity although there is still the need to maintain social distancing. It is also possible for the congregation to sing carols outside which they are not able to do inside.

The obvious downside with an outdoor service is the possibility of bad weather.

(c) Livestreaming

Because of the generosity of Dan Gruner, a parishioner in Galhampton, and his colleagues who have freely offered their professional services and expertise we have been able to consider the option of livestreaming from St Michael's North Cadbury.

We anticipated that the numbers of those who might wish to attend the Camelot Carol Service at St Michael's North Cadbury on Sunday 20th December were likely to be considerably greater than our socially distanced capacity. For this reason we decided to pursue the option of livestreaming this service with only the participants present.

The alternative would have been either to adopt a strict ticketing system or to turn people away at the door and we did not wish to do this. The livestreaming will at a later point then be uploaded as a recording available for everyone to view with a link given through the website, Cutting Edge Camelot and any other appropriate means.

(d) Recorded service

The midnight service on Christmas Eve at St Michael's North Cadbury was also likely to provide similar social distancing issues. For this service we have opted to make a recording of this Christmas Communion available from 11.30 onwards on Christmas Eve. Again the link will be given through the website, Cutting Edge Camelot and any other appropriate means.

In the event that the weather is so bad on Christmas Day that it makes outdoor services impractical this recorded service also provides an available back up in the event that people are not able to come to an outdoor service.

Please remember

Meeting inside church

Under Tier 2 restrictions we are allowed to come to church to worship but we are not allowed to meet each other outside of our own household/bubble (on Christmas Day this includes 'Christmas Bubbles' of up to three households).

We need to interpret these regulations sensibly. We do not think that they are meant to exclude greeting or acknowledging the presence of other people. However, they do mean that within the church we should not engage in conversations of any length outside our household or bubble either before or after the church service. This may result in going outside the church in which case...

Meeting outside church

We may go outside church. Tier 2 regulations here are less strict although their impact is still very real. Outside it is possible to meet with friends and family

we do not live with in a group of no more than six (the so called 'rule of six'). However, the need for social distancing still applies and although such meetings are possible we have been advised to be careful in terms of the total number of meetings we have.

Christmas Bubbles

On Christmas Day only there are so called 'Christmas Bubbles'. These are groups formed by up to three households but with no overall restrictions on numbers. They are able to meet in places of worship. They do not need to sit together but must not interact outside their own bubble.

Carol singing outdoors

The congregation can sing as part of a service, allowing for appropriate social distancing.

Carol singing indoors

Congregations cannot sing although a small choir, limited in size so far as possible can sing.

Let us know your plans

If you are intending to come to a Christmas service (particularly an indoor service) which you do not normally attend it would be greatly appreciated if you could let the relevant churchwarden(s) know in advance. This will very much help them in their planning for safe social distancing at these services.

INTERVIEW -Through the dark times



Sir Ranulph Fiennes, who lives on one of Exmoor's highest hill farms, is the world's greatest living explorer. He explains what's kept him going in some of his toughest and darkest moments – and shares a few lockdown tips.

What kept you going through your toughest challenges?

At a time when we were making our living by trying to break world records, my late wife Ginny decided we could go round the earth vertically without flying, 52,000 miles. It involved things which had not been done, like crossing Antarctica, which is bigger than America. We had an eight month period of darkness, living in a tiny hut under the snow, it was quite difficult from time to time. One of the things which was very helpful was my wife's pet Jack Russell Bothy, who was a huge help just playing ball, for example. We just had to learn to be I wouldn't dare to give patient. lessons on being patient, but I know it's worth doing!

What advice would you give for people for coping with a Christmas in Covid times?

Some people who are accustomed to living alone have worked out a daily schedule, whether half an hour of TV, cooking, walking, going to sleep at a certain time. That sounds boring but it can help hugely against depression. Phoning someone up can make a day much more survivable. You can be ingenious, get a window box, paint inside, or outside, little things like that – try very hard to make yourself aim at something. That can make all the difference.

How will you cope this Christmas?

Christmas is going to be difficult for many, many people. I always say if I'm feeling despondent, read the Economist, it'll tell you what is happening to everyone else in the world, everything is relative!

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

The following topics were among matters discussed at the virtual meeting of North Cadbury and Yarlington PC held on 28th October 2020.

<u>Clare Field, Ridgeway Lane, North Cadbury – Presentation of</u> <u>Initial Plans for Development</u>

Mr A Tregay, Boon Brown presented the initial conceptual plans of the scheme at Ridgeway Lane prior to formal consultation with PC, neighbours/residents.

The Chairman informed residents that the presentation by Mr Tregay would not constitute a formal consultation. Mr Tregay had given his assurance to the Chairman that the PC and neighbours/residents would have the opportunity to comment and ask questions during the formal consultation process at pre- application and post-application stages, which would be held at a later date, which was also confirmed by Mr Tregay.

Mr Tregay stated that this was the start of a constructive dialogue with the PC in order to give an indication of the proposed development during the early stages and to hopefully receive feedback. The aim was to keep the PC and neighbours informed as much as possible. He advised that the format for the formal consultation was yet to be determined due to Covid-19. They would normally present at an open evening/afternoon in a village hall, however, it may need to be a digital or written process but he would continue to liaise with the PC to make sure everyone involved is notified.

Mr Tregay outlined the proposals on behalf of his Client, Mr P Longman, for the residential development of Clare Field, Ridgeway Lane, North Cadbury. He advised that the plans were conceptual and, therefore, subject to change, however, they would give a good indication of the direction of the scheme. The development would be in the region of 80 new homes, 35% [28] of which would be 'affordable'. Reports from County and District Councillors

<u>D.Cllr Hobhouse</u> reported that the Government had recently written to all District and County Councils, including BANES and North Somerset regarding unitary authorities. However, the numbers would not allow for one unitary authority if BANES and North Somerset were included, which would mean there could be two or three unitary authorities. Cllr. Hobhouse was doubtful that the Government knew the possible results of its proposals.

<u>C.Cllr Lewis reported</u> that he had requested an answer on the subject of Ash Die-back trees that abut the highways, raised by Cllr. Archie Montgomery, but as yet had had no response.

Covid-19 There was still a need for individuals to stay safe. The details about the pandemic from both the District and the County Council are sent on a regular and weekly basis to the Clerk.

The current consultation on the Government White Paper on Planning raised the prospect of the lack of a 5 year land supply might be deleted from the current National Planning Policy Framework.

Highways and Rights of Way (RoW)

Full Highways and RoW reports can be found as attachments to the PC minutes on its website https://www.northcadbury.org.uk/

The PC agreed unanimously to the provision and installation of 3 Woolston Village name plates at a total cost of approx. £600, following an onsite meeting with Mr G Warren, SCC Highways Engineer. Cllr Rundle reported that a number of residents in Woolston were willing to contribute towards the scheme. The PC agreed to share the cost of the scheme, with both residents and the PC contributing £300 each; the PC would make up any deficit as necessary.


