From the Rectory

As I write we are in an 'in between' period in the church's year, the interval between the celebration of Jesus' Ascension into heaven and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

And in terms of the coronavirus emergency, we might also think of ourselves as being in rather an 'in between' time. Yes, unlocking is taking place but in the light of last week's announcement concerning the Indian variant the future still seems very uncertain.

One of our readings for last Sunday comes from the book of Acts. This reflects the mood and preoccupations of the period 'in between' the Ascension and Pentecost. The disciples have a choice to make, that of a replacement apostle for Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus.

One option that they had was simply to postpone making any choice. After all, it is hard to make a decision when we are uncertain what the long-term future might hold. And sometimes simply postponing a decision is the right choice to make.

But we cannot always do this. Sometimes even though the future may be very uncertain we have to trust God and do what we can even if we might wish we had a fuller picture of what is going on.

And in this case the disciples decide that they cannot postpone their choice. They come up with two candidates, Joseph and Matthias, who both fulfilled the qualifications for the vacant



position. They were both people who had been with Jesus from the start of His earthly ministry and who could be a witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

So how to choose between them? Although they cast lots this was not the sign of a random process. Rather it was made in the deep trust that God would use this means to show them the right person. The process was framed by prayer and an understanding that only God can know what is in someone's heart. They were confident that God would work through the casting of lots.

This reminds us of the crucial role of prayer in 'in between' times when we are uncertain as to which path to follow in the road ahead.

As well as prayer, perhaps kindness is much in need at this 'in between' time. For we each have different fears and vulnerabilities. We need to respect such differences and to be understanding of different viewpoints. And where decisions cannot be postponed and do need to be made, then we need to take everyone's position into account as we make these decisions.

125 years ago, on 4th June 1896, Henry Ford completed his first automobile, the Ford Quadricycle, and gave it a test run around Detroit Michigan. It was a simple frame with an engine, two gears, a tiller for steering and four bicycle wheels. It had a top speed of 20mph. Its success led him to establish the Ford Motor Company.

90 years ago, on 13th June 1931, Jesse Boot, 1st Baron Trent, British pharmacist and philanthropist, died. He had turned his father's Boots Company into a national chain of chemists.

80 years ago, from 22nd June to 5th December 1941, Operation Barbarossa took place. It was the German invasion of the Soviet Union, the largest military operation in history. In the end, it was a Soviet victory, for the German invaders were repelled when they reached Moscow, and then driven out of Russia by a Soviet counter-attack.

65 years ago, on 13th June 1956, the first European Cup final was held, in Paris. Real Madrid (Spain) beat Stade de Reims (France) 4-3. The European Cup is now known as the UEFA Champions League.



From the Bishop

'I am always ready to learn although I do not always like being taught,' wrote Winston Churchill. I think many of us would echo that thought!

A huge 'thank you' to our teachers and all who support our schools! There has been a tremendous effort across our diocese to ensure our children have been able to continue their education during lockdowns and the need to restrict normal practice. Not only have the children been learning but teaching staff have also been going 'back to school' in order to find new means of communication. Governors. church communities and individual volunteers have gone the extra mile too, to encourage our teachers through gifts and cards and prayer. The whole school team deserves our gratitude.

Learning online is a challenge. Those of us who are spending many hours in Zoom rooms online these days can vouch for that. It's tiring! And it is not just our children who have found it so. At the end of this month we shall be celebrating the ordinations of our new priests. Last year they were ordained as deacons in September following three months as lay curates result of the pandemic as a restrictions.

What a year to be a deacon! They've had a very different learning experience than would normally be

| expected. Not so much opportunity of the 'hands-on' experience yet perhaps an even more profound learning possibility. I'm looking forward to hearing their stories!

We shall be repeating the new pattern of ordinations with our incoming deacons being licensed as lay curates initially this June. For them, colleges and courses have taken place principally online and they've had experience of digital worship on top of regular lectures and seminars. How might that prepare them for our 'new normal' of blended worship, with live-streaming of services in person?

As the Church emerges into this 'new normal' we have the opportunity together to learn and discover new things, new gifts, new ways of being the people of God. It is the same good God, the same story of His love to share with others, but there's a new landscape. How might you and your community respond to that? What have you learnt in this time? And how might that learning change you and the way you do things? Do share your stories with us!

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

The following topics were among matters discussed at the virtual meetings of North Cadbury and Yarlington PC and the Annual Parish Meetings held in April and May 2021.

Reports from County and District Councillors

<u>C.Cllr Lewis</u> previously circulated Somerset County Council's (SCC) Briefing for Annual Parish and Town Council meetings, which can be found at Attachment 1 of Yarlington's Annual Parish Meeting draft minutes on the Parish website:

<u>D.Cllr Hobhouse</u> reported that South Somerset District Council (SSDC) had been extremely busy during the Coronavirus pandemic, co-ordinating and processing the business grants while managing all other aspects related to the virus itself. SSDC staff had been manning the vaccination centres since they opened in December 2020, however, staff were now getting back to operating out of the District Council offices.

Cllr Hobhouse was disappointed that councils could not meet remotely with effect from 7th May 2021. It is his belief that councillors do not need to travel all over the district to attend meetings when this could be achieved without using petrol and diesel. SSDC were working hard in an attempt to get the Government to change its mind to allow people to continue to meet remotely, however the Government claims that they don't have the parliamentary time to do so.

Cllr Hobhouse reported that there would be an on line poll for residents to vote on which of the two Unitary Authority (UA) proposals they would like for the future of Somerset; SCC's 'One Somerset', a single UA or the District Council's 'Stronger Somerset', a two UA. He hoped that the results of the poll would help guide the Secretary of State's final decision which was due to announced on 28th June 2021.

<u>D.Cllr Messenger</u>. The Clerk read out the report on behalf of D.Cllr Messenger. "SSDC gave away 775 trees in the 'Great Parish Tree Give-Away'. Community tree groups planted a further 2,235 trees and the Urban Tree Challenge planted 900 trees.

Waste collection from the 28th June will be every three weeks depending where you live, in addition there will be blue bags given for more recycling.

SSDC's Chief Executive, Alex Parmley, is to step down from his role after almost five years for a new life in New Zealand; we wish him well.

On the 6th April 2021 Cllr Messenger met with Helen Smith and John Nicolson to discuss the Fulford Cross flooding at the bottom of South

Cary Lane; he was assured that it would be dealt with before next winter.

Due to the scale of the covid-19 vaccination project and to provide more vaccination appointment availability for patients, the clinic has moved from the vaccination hub at Wincanton Community Hospital to Haynes International Motor Museum from 1st May 2021. D.Cllr Messenger praised the excellent efforts of the staff from SSDC, Millbrook Surgery, Castle Cary, local hospitals and volunteers, who have worked hard every day since the start of vaccination roll out program.

At Full Council meetings at Mendip, Sedgemoor, Somerset West and Taunton and SSDC, 84% of councillors voted to support the proposal 'Stronger Somerset' for a twin unitary authority. Residents will have the opportunity to have their say through a postal vote. Phosphate remains a huge problem for many planning applications; Cllr Messenger advised that residents should lobby their local MPs."



Wordsearch: St Alban - the first British martyr

Persecution of Christians worldwide is rising fast, so it is worth remembering St Alban, the first British martyr. Alban was a Roman citizen living in England when the Roman emperor, Diocletian, began a fierce persecution. Soon Alban found a desperate priest on his doorstep, hunted by local soldiers. Alban gave the priest shelter, and within days was converted. When the soldiers arrived, Alban took the priest's place, refused to offer sacrifice to the Roman gods, and was condemned to death. Alban went to his execution on $22^{\rm nd}$ June 250AD with such serenity that one of the executioners was converted. He died on the site of the Hertfordshire town that now bears his name.










