

From the Rectory

In times of uncertainty it is not unnatural to be anxious. In this time of the pandemic and its aftermath there has been so much that we could worry about.

And sometimes what begins as a very specific worry develops into a much more general sense of anxiety. Indeed we can reach the stage when we know that we are worried but can't remember what exactly it is that we are worried about.

And although we know in our heads that we should not worry, the simple advice 'Stop worrying' often seems to make things worse because we find ourselves completely unable to act on this

There are simple and practical steps that we can take. Prayer is certainly one of them. It is not as if all our cares and anxieties magically vanish the first time we lift them to God. This may happen but more often we find that we need to keep praying over the same issues each day. And we can find that slowly and over time the power and hold of these anxieties lessens.

And it also helps to share our anxieties by talking about them with other people. Yet these others need to be the right kind of people, those willing to listen rather than speak and offer advice.

Such measures do indeed help. But when Jesus tells us in the Sermon on the Mount 'Do not worry about your life' He addresses the issue of worry at a deeper level.



He calls us to look at the natural world, the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. They entirely depend on God for their continued existence. Are we willing to have a similar level of trust? So as we look around and admire the beauties of this countryside in which we live, we can find the comfort of a greater, more lasting perspective.

This greater perspective is that of the Kingdom of God. Jesus challenges us to ask ourselves what the purpose of our lives is and what we are living for. Most of the time we worry about the material, physical necessities of life. But Jesus reminds us that there is something even more fundamental to our lives. He calls us to have an undivided trust in God and promises that if we have this as a priority everything else that we are concerned about will follow.

A challenging message indeed. But a relevant one for this time of Harvest. There is so much to be grateful for in the abundance of God's natural provision for us. Yet even greater than that is God's spiritual provision to us in the form of Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of God.



From the Assistant Bishop

Whenever I listen to one of Iesus' searching questions to his listeners I find myself thinking "What would I do in these circumstances?"

If I were casting my nets, and Jesus said "follow me", would I do it? I imagine many of us would be hoping that we never have to find out

All too often it's assumed that being called is just about the religious life to a particular ministry, lay or ordained in the life of the Church. Of course, it is about that for some of us, and thank God for that, but in the New Testament, vocation or calling much wider has а Made understanding.

for a St Paul talks to Corinthians about this more general call when he purpose writes "Now there are varieties of gifts but the same spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

Every one of us is called to use the gift or gifts we've been given to help build up the body of Christ. That "building up" can never be confined to what we do on Sunday. Building up is about using the whole of life, including Monday to Saturday. The very act of working or being at home, school, work, leisure is vocational. Our daily behaviour becomes a sacrament and an



offering.

The realisation that we are being called comes in many different ways. For some, it's like a sudden flash of light as came to St Paul on the Damascus road. But for others, it's just

not that clear. In my earlier work as a Director of Ordinands and Vocation, I listened to many people who described their sense of calling as a feeling of discomfort. "Like having a toothache" someone said -

their "yes" a moving towards a sense of peace and clarity.

Perhaps, as you read this, you know what God is calling you to do. Perhaps you're still searching. But remember, God has made you for a purpose. And God will work that out, but in his own time, not yours. Our forthcoming Archdeaconry Days which will take place early next year, February 6th to 12th, with the theme of "God calls... everyone, everywhere". One thing I can guarantee: if you book in, you won't be alone and you'll have a great day.

INTERVIEW - Where I am meant to be



Tracey Staples, Church Administrator, Exmoor explains why she feels her role is her ministry.

Why do you feel your role is your ministry?

I feel it is where I am meant to be. It is where has God has called me – it may not be what I set out to do, but it is where I am and it feels right. The knowledge and skills that I have gained on the way seem to be what people need at the moment.

What makes it feel like your calling?

I was a ballet teacher but a drunk driver put paid to that by crashing into me so I retrained as a primary school teacher and started helping out in my church office when I wasn't working. After having some medical issues I moved back to mum and dad's and started helping dad – who trained for ordination as I was training to be a teacher - with a bit of admin. It just seems I've always been pulled back to church administration.

Did you always consider it your ministry?

No, I became aware of it over time. As I felt I kept being called back, it came to feel it was my ministry. I took on more admin responsibilities when my dad became ill and when he died I was asked to take on the admin of eight parishes. I am now full time and look after 18 parishes in Exmoor deanery.

Do you see other people living out their ministry when perhaps they don't?

Absolutely, I see it in people from the organist to the person who is good at listening. We need to get over the fact that ministry is for everyone and remember we are all the body of Christ.
