From the Rectory

From time to time the Parish Office receives a request for editions of Excalibur that need to be made available to the British Library and other official libraries in the United Kingdom. This, I understand, is rather more than a request; it is a legal obligation.

And so this acts as a further incentive to me to be quite sure of the details that I pass on of Camelot People to Rob each month for Excalibur. For these details will be made known not simply to our regular readership but also the wider research community and others who consult these libraries.

And obviously this is helpful for historical purposes. But as I reflected on this in the context of our recent Remembrance Day services I thought it also had something important to say to us about the value that God places on each human life and how the care and detail with which we record important life events reflects something of this concern.

At Remembrance Sunday of course we remember the impact of conflict on members of our family and on our friends. There may be very specific memories that we wish to hold before God, perhaps of people who served alongside us and who did not return from wars or tours of duties. On that occasion we especially remember and honour them.

Remembrance Sunday is, however, placed within what we might call a church season of remembrance. It



began at the start of this month with All Saints and All Souls days. At All Saints we remember all Christian disciples, famous or obscure. And at All Souls we remember all our loved ones whom we have lost through death.

And, of course, we will also soon start to look forward to Christmas. Christmas where we celebrate that God came to us on this earth in the form of a tiny baby Jesus whose mother Mary was a humble and ordinary young woman. Ordinary, yes, but extraordinary in terms of her faith.

All this reminds us that everyone matters to God. You do not need to be rich, powerful and famous to be important in God's sight. Each single life and death, however obscure, matters. Our Christian faith affirms the value of each human life. Each person is important and unique because each person is made in the image of God. And more than that God cares about each one of us enough to send His Son to be our Saviour and to die for us. The value of each human life is immeasurable.




How will you celebrate with young people in your church?






100 Years of Remembrance

In the week leading up to 11th November our children carefully decorated a glass jar, which was then placed at the church on Thursday 11th





At our meeting on October 20th, Sally Morgan spoke about the Climate Change Garden. This is obviously what we all have to be thinking about now that our seasons are so changeable and the hot spells mean that we are short of water but we also have too much sometimes and floods.

There are ways to help our gardens cope with all of this: i.e. one simple way is if we know that a rainstorm is coming to empty our water butts into buckets. We could try having green roofs on sheds and outbuildings. We should have permeable surfaces on our drives: slate and gravel, not concrete or bitumen.

To help when there is too little water we should not dig. Mulches of garden compost, leaf mould , straw and gravel should be used everywhere. We should grow plants with deep roots. We should avoid watering and weeding. Bulbs such as tulips or crocuses should be planted in shady areas. Gardens with grasses, sedum, lavender or herbs will help as they don't need as much water and don't lose it through transpiration.

The advantages of these changes are that we may soon be able to have a more continental garden and be able to grow olives, grapes, oranges and lemons as well as succulents in our hanging baskets.

Above all the message is to save and

harvest water, not to use peat, to improve biodiversity and to plant trees and shrubs for shade.

At our meeting on November 17th Adam from Castle Gardens talked about Container Gardening. Containers on patios and small places are ideal but can also be useful in larger gardens. They can be moved around each season and according to whether they need full sunlight or shade or if they have a nice scent. It is also easier to garden in containers! Pots can even be put on tables to work on. We may not have thought of putting fruit bushes in them but they do well, especially raspberries, blackberries and blueberries and others which need ericaceous compost.

Of course terracotta and pottery pots can be heavy but there are now modern pots which are lighter, often decorated and attractive. Learning about the compost was interesting: The main message is to use peat free of course and the Garden Group is working hard to improve on this.

A few plants recommended for containers which we may not have thought of are camelias, ericas, hellebores, heucheras, evergreen clematis and patio clematis. The usual agapanthus, cyclamen, primulas, violas and of course all the bulbs which are so cheering to see when they start growing from January were also mentioned.

It was an interesting, informative and entertaining evening.

Our next meeting on the third Wednesday in December will be a social one: the Christmas lunch. We will then hold our AGM on the third Wednesday in January. When we start again in February everyone is invited, old or new members and visitors (a £2 entrance fee is asked for). We all look forward to our very interesting talks which are also social events
