### From the Rectory

As this edition of Excalibur comes to press we are preparing to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. There will be various church and community events to mark this occasion and you will find details of these later on in this Excalibur.

A reign and service of seventy years is a remarkable achievement. Indeed it is now by a distance the longest in our history.

And as we think of all the responsibility that has rested on the Queen's shoulders over such a long period of time perhaps this reminds of our own responsibilities. For in different ways we all share the responsibility of ruling. The sphere of our rule may be our own family, our work or in our voluntary activities. What do we most need to fulfil these responsibilities?

There are no doubt different, equally valid answers to this question. But my guess would be that if we replied 'Wisdom' this would command a fair degree of agreement. Over a short period, yes, other qualities like boldness and strength might be most immediately looked for. However, in order to sustain any rule over a long period of time surely wisdom lies at the heart of this. For over time it is who we truly are and the values that guide us which are tested and revealed.

We often associate wisdom with experience and years. And indeed in the Queen's case this is relevant. For instance, in her speech encouraging us at the start of the pandemic lockdown



she used the phrase 'We'll meet again'. This harked back to a well known song of the Second World War in which the Queen had seen active service. She was able to draw on this experience of long ago in order to offer reassurance and stability in the present day.

However, wisdom is not simply a result of experience. Some people, for instance, never seem to learn from their mistakes and they go on repeating them. And by contrast others seem to be wise beyond their years.

In order to be wise, it is important for us to know what we do not know and to know what depends on us and what we need to leave to God. As is clear from the Queen's public statements she looks beyond herself for her source of wisdom to Christ and to Christ's teachings. This surely is where wisdom is to be found. For as the apostle Paul puts it, in Christ are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge (see Colossians 2:2-3).



250 years ago, on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1772, the Court of King's Bench ruled that slavery was illegal in England and Wales. It remained legal in British overseas territories and colonies until 1833.

40 years ago, on 14<sup>th</sup> June 1982, the Falklands War ended. Argentine forces surrendered to the British in Port Stanley and a ceasefire was agreed.

10 years ago, on 24<sup>th</sup> June 2012, Lonesome George, the male Pinta Island tortoise died. The last-known member of his species, Lonesome George serves as an important symbol for conservation efforts around the world and particularly in the Galapagos Islands.



### **New Bishop**

On 28<sup>th</sup> April 2022 Downing Street announced that the Rt Revd Michael Beasley will be the next Bishop of Bath and Wells. Currently the Bishop of Hertford, prior to taking a fulltime role with the church. Bishop Michael was an epidemiologist, a background he was called on to use during the pandemic as a member of the Church of England's Covid task force. He is already familiar with Somerset. His wife Lizzie is from a local farming family and before his interview for the role they both undertook a 60 mile walk around the county.

### INTERVIEW -50 years supporting children

Margot Sampson MBE has just stepped down as chair of The Children's Society Winscombe St James Fundraising Committee, after 23 years.



## How did you get involved with the Children's Society?

It has played a significant role in my life for over 50 years. It all began when I was a young mother, when our then Vicar, Revd Bernard Salmon approached me when the existing representative retired. At that time there were just six charity boxholders who met once a year.

#### How did you get on at first?

I felt committed to ongoing support once I discovered what it was all about. My own background did not prepare me for what I was to learn about the lives of so many of the young people with whom I had lived and gone to school. It was a learning experience for which I was totally unprepared and it mortified me.

## How have things changed over the years?

We have learned to adapt to the changing needs and attitudes of society. We used to knock on every door for our annual collection but now we collect at local supermarkets. At our height we had 127 box holders.

## Is there anything in particular you have enjoyed?

Paul and Mo's Open Garden Day and our Christingle Services. Their ability to communicate Christian love and fellowship through superb food and comradeship is incredible. We were one of the first churches in the UK to introduce Christingles and because we live in a cider area, we represent the world with an apple from the Church orchards.

## How do you feel about your time with the Children's Society?

It has been for me a truly meaningful and appreciated part of my life. Because of my involvement with the Children's Society I have learned so much and I give it – and always will – my deepest thanks and love.




