


From the Rectory

As we look forward to the summer and hopefully the prospect of more warm weather we are preparing to welcome to our churches a student who is looking to be ordained. So if you see someone you don't recognise at a service in the next month or so that may well be her!

Her name is Coelette Parks. She lives in Yeovil and has practised as a dentist. She has already had extensive experience of church leadership through being a churchwarden and working with young families. The purpose of her placement is to introduce her to a different context of Christian ministry from the one in which she is familiar.

As I prepare for her placement I am reminded of the role encouragement plays in the Christian life. We all need encouragement. If we look back at our lives we will no doubt find many people who have offered us encouragement and to whom we owe a debt of gratitude. They may have befriended us when we were starting a new job and felt nervous and insecure. They may have helped us to keep on going when we were facing what seemed like insurmountable difficulties. Or they may have been really good trainers able to pass on what they had learnt to others.

In the Bible, encouragement is viewed as a very important quality. God is described as the God of encouragement (Romans 15:5). The gift of prophecy is one of encouragement (1 Corinthians 14:3). And perhaps most of all we find encouragement embodied within а person, Barnabas, whose very name means 'Son of Encouragement' (Acts 4:36).



Although Barnabas is a well known figure in the early church perhaps an even more famous one is the apostle Paul. And yet it is worth remembering that had it not Barnabas' been for ministry of encouragement we might well never have heard of Paul and his ministry. F or Paul had been leading the persecution of Christians in the early church when he was dramatically converted on the road to Not surprisingly the other Damascus. believers were very suspicious, wondering whether Paul's conversion was genuine or whether it was a trap being laid for them. And at this point Barnabas vouched for Paul's genuineness and secured his acceptance by the rest of the church.

Later on Barnabas and Paul went off on missionary journeys together. At first it was Barnabas as the senior of the two who took the lead. But as the journeys progressed Barnabas was content to take a supporting role and to encourage Paul in his own leadership.

Surely this is a reminder to us that to be effective we do not necessarily need to be in charge. Someone who has the humility to support and encourage others can be just as important although maybe not quite so well known. So we all need to grow in this gift of encouragement.


175 years ago, on 24^{th} July 1847, Salt Lake City in Utah was founded by Mormon pioneers, led by Brigham Young.

75 years ago, on 9th July 1947, Buckingham Palace announced the engagement of Princess Elizabeth (later Queen Elizabeth II) to Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten.

60 years ago, on 10th July 1962, Swedish engineer Nils Bohlin was granted a US patent for the three-point safety belt for vehicles. It is now used in practically all road vehicles.

25 years ago, on 1^{st} July 1997, the UK returned Hong Kong to China after more than 150 years.

'Church of England has good skills', says new Bishop

The next Bishop of Bath and Wells, Dr Michael Beasley, has said that the Church of England learned valuable lessons during the pandemic. "There's been a huge amount that we've seen in our response to an emergency. It shows we have a flexibility and a resilience and an ability to respond to situations that we might not have known we have, but now we do."

He said that such resilience will be needed, to cope in these "challenging times", with the world still emerging from the pandemic, the war in Ukraine, and the cost-of-living crisis, "which is only to become increasingly urgent.".

He said: "Addressing these issues is going to demand everyone's faith and experiences, their creativity and skill."

INTERVIEW -The streets are paved with prayer

One of the speakers at the Celebration of Lay Ministries (see page 6) is Dave Knight, Chairman for Taunton Street Pastors. We talking to him about his ministry.



What are Street Pastors?

Street Pastors are trained volunteers who care about their community and patrol their local area on weekend evenings. Taunton team's 75 volunteers cover Taunton, Bridgwater and Wellington.

What do they do?

Most of the time it is simply a case of being present, talking to those who want to talk. We are not there to preach but we do talk about Jesus a lot - it's just that we let the other person lead the conversation rather than us pushing it.

What about the other times?

Every night there is a potential for challenging situations, which may or not be realised. We know that we save about two or three lives a year and prevent a similar number of rapes, but you can never be totally sure. Our priority is looking after those who are alone, perhaps after becoming isolated from friends, who are in a potentially vulnerable position.

Is it safe for you?

We take safety very seriously and our training is very thorough. We know what to do, and we always stay together. When I first heard of Street Pastors I was reluctant to get involved as I felt it wasn't safe, but it really is. Three years later I heard a talk on Street Pastors at my church and responded - 10 years on I'm still doing it.

Why do you do it?

It is amazing ministry! It may sound serious but we really do have a ball out there. You are in this hotspot of activity, the front line, and where street pastors have been going for some time, those streets have been paved with prayer. You are taking all that power and presence of God with you. It has to be seen to be believed.



10th July brings us Sea Sunday, the day when Christian churches remember, pray and give thanks for the more than 1.5 million merchant seafarers and fishermen worldwide. If seafarers seem irrelevant to your daily life, think again: 90 per cent of everything you buy in the shops comes to you by sea. Merchant seafarers quite literally keep our global economy afloat. Yet it is a tough life, far from loved ones. Merchant ships are harsh working environments, never mind the threat of piracy or even shipwreck.

To help the seafarers, a worldwide network of port chaplains has sprung up. They offer hospitality and friendship, as well as practical, emotional and spiritual support, providing almost a 'home from home' in hundreds of ports, in more than 50 countries. You might wish to support one of these three well-known societies: The Mission to Seafarers (Anglican), The Apostolate of the Sea (Roman Catholic), and The Sailors' Society (inter-denominational).


