From our Assistant Priest

The heatwave may have passed, but the effects are still with us. Driving through the countryside, I noticed there are already autumn shades in some of the trees, and now what I still call my lawn is covered with falling leaves. Autumn is a season of change, but we maybe weren't expecting it so soon. Sam Cooke wrote *A change is* gonna come. I have the Otis Redding version. A powerful song of yearning. At a time when African Americans were still fighting for rights that white people take for granted, they looked forward to change for the better. For a lot of us, if our lives are settled and comfortable, change is a slightly scary prospect. What we really want is things to stay the same. For some of us, a change of address. work. brings or challenges. And for others. bereavement brings change, and that change is permanent, with challenges to be met. Everyone who has lost one they have loved has to cope with that change.

Like it or not, Camelot parishes are facing change. Not this year, but next, when Tristram retires (I agree - he looks too young to retire. I guess it's down to clean living). And at the moment, there is little we can do to prepare for that change. We don't know whether Tristram will he replaced, and we don't even know whether Camelot will stay together as a group. If someone at Bath and Wells knows, they aren't saying.

Our one recourse is to offer the whole situation to God in prayer, and trust



that whatever happens will be in accordance with his will. On 24th September, a Saturday, we're having a Quiet Day at Woolston - there are details elsewhere in Excalibur (*page 7*). We'll be focussing on change, and how we might face it together. Put the date in your diary now.

The change from summer to autumn is usually a time of great beauty, and the worst of it is that winter follows. But even winter has its charms, and we know that under the snow (remember snow?) new life is about to happen. Maybe that's how it will be for our churches - what seems to be a change for the worse might be a time of new life, and new growth. And we can be preparing for that now - remember, we have a year's notice - it's not being sprung on us unawares. There will be all sorts of opportunities to find our own talents and ministries, that we can use serving God in our churches, and our communities. We have time to prepare. We'll be alright. God is with us. Everything changes except him.





INTERVIEW - With God's help

Revd Kevin Wright has witnessed generosity in action since he became Rector of The Benefice of Three Saints.



How have you witnessed generosity in your church?

Having arrived here in March 2019, I was just getting my head round things when the pandemic hit. My predecessor and his then treasurer had the vision to encourage generosity and to encourage the church family to donate via standing order but unfortunately with limited success, now most give regularly by this method.

What changed?

It was a combination of factors. A new face making the request can help get the message across and we also made clear that we were requesting donations to our Church Life Fund, that the money donated would be

spent on keeping the church family going by supporting mission and ministry, and I think that helped. The pandemic also had an impact as people appreciated our online ministry and were mindful that they couldn't donate in person. The whole process was underpinned with prayer.

So have people been more generous?

Yes. We have moved from being in a position of struggling to pay all our parish share, the pot that all churches contribute into to pay for ministry and mission across the diocese as a whole, to being in a position to be able to pay for more than we are asked for which is wonderful.

What about your church buildings?

Unfortunately, it isn't all good news. Like many churches, we are still struggling to pay the bills for our church buildings, which rely on separate accounts. But I give thanks to God for the committed church family we have here, for their incredible generosity and for the position we are in.






