From the Rectory

In this edition we look forward in anticipation to Christmas. Hopefully for many of us Christmas will be a time of celebration and joy, a chance to take a break and to strengthen ties with family, friends and community. for many it will also overshadowed by continuing economic pressure. In this benefice we continue to support the Lord's Larder and other foodbanks in our area. This support is very much appreciated. In our last Deanery Synod we learnt also about another, parallel effort a Community Fridge which is available in some churches in our Deanery.

And yet the fact that such initiatives are needed at all is an unwelcome sign of the times. So, many families will be looking forward to winter and to Christmas not with joy and anticipation but with fear and trepidation.

And yet as we celebrate the birth of Christ at Christmas there are many different aspects to our celebration. In the church's year we think of Christmas as having perhaps a 'lighter' feel to it than Easter and in particular Good Friday when we remember Christ's Crucifixion.

But, in the words of T S Eliot which begin and end his poem *East Coker*, 'In my beginning is my end' and 'In my end is my beginning.' There is more in common between the celebrations of Christmas and of Easter than might appear at first sight.

The shadow of the Cross does indeed fall across the accounts of Jesus' birth.



We find it in the words of Simeon when his mother Mary presents the baby Jesus at the Temple. Simeon tells Mary, 'This child is destined...to be a sign that will be opposed...and a sword will pierce your own soul too.' (Luke 2: 34-35). We find it in Jesus' birth in a stable because there is no room at the inn. This can often be romanticised but the stable was no doubt not a comfortable place and was a sign of exclusion from the social mainstream. And then there is the account in Matthew of the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt to escape the terrible persecution and massacre instigated by Herod. This latter is, for obvious reasons, not often included in our readings for Christmas carols.

And yet it is the full message of Christmas which we need in order to address the realities of our times. This message is one of joy and celebration. However, it does not minimise the presence of pain and suffering in our world. But, as with the Resurrection, our hope and faith as Christians is that in the end Christ and Christ's love will reign.



How long should we sleep when we are over 50?

The amount of sleep you get each night can have a huge impact on your health. A recent study has found that middle-aged people need at least seven hours a night. This reduces their risk of developing various serious health conditions including cancer, diabetes, and arthritis.

This contrasts with the effect of having only five hours of sleep a night. People over 50 who slept for five hours were found to be 30 per cent more likely to have chronic diseases, including depression, liver disease, stroke, heart disease, diabetes, cancer, and Parkinson's. The researchers were based at University College London (UCL).

Flat Rate Bus Fare Proposal

Somerset Bus Partnership welcomes the Government's plan to provide up to £60 million, to enable bus operators to cap single adult bus fares at £2. The £2 flat fare comes in from the beginning of January and will continue through to the end of to March 2023. Most bus operators are expected to adopt the scheme.

This means millions of people across England will save money, at a time when many households are suffering massive pressures from the rising cost of living. The move will help people travel for work, education, shopping and medical

treatments and provide a much-needed saving in daily expenditure.

The current average single fare for a 3-mile journey is estimated at over £2.80, meaning that the new fare will save passengers almost 30% of the price every time they travel.

In addition, Somerset County Council currently plans to introduce a £1 single/ £2 return bus fare in Taunton, as part of its Bus Service Improvement Plan. Somerset Bus Partnership welcomes this initiative but emphasises the need to procure further funding to enable this flat rate fare to be extended across all of Somerset.

Somerset Bus Partnership Co-Chair, Peter Travis, said, "Bus usage declined in Somerset in the last decade, and even more so during to the pandemic. We need initiatives like these to restore and improve passenger levels. Encouraging people to choose buses over cars helps to reduce carbon emissions. It is estimated that the Government's £60 million will reduce car



From the Bishop

As 2022 comes to a close, our hearts go out to the people of Ukraine whose country was invaded by Russia on the 24th February this year. In the months since, we have watched in civilians. cities horror as infrastructure have been attacked. land occupied and atrocities committed.

The UK has received more than 100,000 people fleeing from the conflict. The gift of their presence among us reminds us that this is no "quarrel in a far away country, between people of whom we His light know nothing".

is never As we recall once again the coming extinguished into the world of Iesus at Christmas, our challenge is to connect our celebration of his birth with the realities and consequences of the conflict that is happening. Sadly, it's not hard to see the links. Iesus was born in a land (Palestine) that had been annexed by an expansionist foreign power (Rome) in pursuit of its territorial ambitions. The demands of the Roman occupiers meant that Jesus' birth happened not at home in Nazareth, but at a counting centre -Bethlehem. He was born in a stable because 'there was no room at the inn'. While still a baby, Jesus became a refugee when taken to Egypt due to warnings of atrocities to come.



Viewed this way, the Christmas story is no sentimental fable. It is a brutal foreshadowing of the events that Ukraine and our whole world

> have encountered this At the same time, it is also a story of hope. For it tells us that even in the very worst that can happen the Christ child whose

birth we celebrate knows all too well the realities of the human condition. As a result, in any darkness his light is never extinguished. For he is Emmanuel -God with us.

So as we come to the end of 2022 we give thanks that God is always with us in whatever we face. May he be with Ukraine. May he be with Russia. And may he be welcomed by us all.

INTERVIEW -Offering a warm welcome

The community in and around Wiveliscombe has come together to offer support to their Ukrainian guests, which will be vital over Christmas.

How did you set up your community support?

When we realised Ukrainian refugees would be coming to our area we realised we would need to have a coordinated approach so we set up a community organisation, Wivey Welcomes Refugees. Because of our rural setting we tried to bring people from the same area here together and thanks to the Facebook group, Taunton Homes for Ukraine, we matched about 95 per cent of people.

What support did you first offer?

Our visitors first priority was to learn English and that's when we started planning to set up a Welcome Hub. St Andrew's in Wiveliscombe was the first to open their doors to us. They already ran a Café for All on Thursday mornings and made it clear we were welcome to come and use their space for whatever we wanted to do. One lesson a week quickly became three.

What did that develop?

The wrap around care is important. The community volunteers come into the lessons to help and also offer friendship and trusted practical support for our visitors. The opportunity to build up friendships

with fellow Ukrainians, has also been really important, especially for those who are living out in the countryside and not near any fellow Ukrainians, and that has created a wonderful atmosphere.

What about Christmas?

Christmas will obviously be a difficult time as every one of my guests has loved ones back in Ukraine who they are worried about, especially with the recent targeting of power structures in Ukraine. They are strong and resilient people but a Christmas away from home will be challenging and hospitality the friendships. particularly support will be important. One of our community partners is making plans to mark Orthodox Christmas on 7th January and we hope to follow up the success of our recent joint service with a Ukrainian/British carol service.





We were told that the speaker's father had become a boy apprentice at the end of the 19th century and he worked dawn to dusk and later – initially cleaning flower pots all day for 6 months. So much potting-on of bedding plants took place on the large estate that a vast quantity of pots were used.

He worked his way up the gardening ladder, moving around the country from estate to estate over many years. There were stories of the lawn mowing performance which involved 14 men and boys and 2 horses pulling mowers to achieve a checkerboard pattern on the lawns which had to be completed before the family came down for breakfast. Finally the boy apprentice arrived at head gardener then set up his own market garden on retirement.

The talk was well attended, and included several guests.
