From the Rectory

In the space of two months monarchs and prime ministers have come and gone. There has been turmoil and uncertainty.

So it is not surprising that in these circumstances that the cry for 'stability' is a resonant one. But where are we to find such stability? For many people our late Queen represented a sense of stability. However, stability cannot be found by looking for it in another person, however remarkable she or he might be. We need to find a stability within ourselves which will sustain us however difficult and uncertain our outward circumstances might be.

And our Christian faith provides us with the resources to do this. In the early centuries of Christianity a new monastic order was founded by St Benedict. One of the values at the heart of the Benedictine rule was stability. In contrast to other monks of his day who wandered from place to place, Benedict required that his monks stayed within and committed themselves to a particular community.

We are not necessarily looking for physical stability in the same way. However, we do look for moral and spiritual stability, qualities which will enable us to make wise and right decisions.

In this search many, wherever they stand in terms of faith, will speak



about values and principles. Values are indeed important. But what happens when two important principles such as loyalty and integrity begin to come into conflict? Then we talk about difficult and painful choices that need to be made.

But as Christians we have more than a set of values to guide us however important these may be. For in the end our faith is about following and being attached to a Person Jesus Christ. So we often find ourselves asking the question, 'What would lesus do?'

And it is in our attachment to Jesus that in the end we find stability. Outward circumstances will always remain the same, indeed they are constantly changing. And yet when there are difficult and complex decisions to be made we can seek Jesus for guidance. That is not a question of throwing our minds away. Rather when we have done our best thinking we need to bring everything before God in prayer and to ask for the leading of the Holy Spirit. For it is the Holy Spirit who makes Jesus and God personal to us.





From the Bishop

As I prepare to be installed as the 80th Bishop of Bath and Wells on the 12th November, I have been reading and re-rereading the charge given to me by the Archbishop of Canterbury when I was legally confirmed as bishop back in June. The charge can found be on the diocesan website. Please do take a look at what it says.

The charge is terrifying. It calls me to walk the way of the cross. It urges me to rely not on my own strength, but on that provided by the Lord. The charge asks me to 'speak out on behalf of the voiceless. and for the rights of all who vulnerable' (Proverbs 3: 18). It reminds me that I am to be the shepherd of the flock entrusted to me. It also includes calls to be committed to highest standards the ofsafeguarding the and care environment.

Reading my charge makes me wonder whether I have been invited to impersonate the Archangel Gabriel! Thankfully it also includes words which act to make the whole thing possible. Chief among these is this phrase: I am called to 'build a church where each stone is valued'.



Drawing on the writings of the First Letter of Peter (see Chapter 2), the charge calls me to remember that I'm not doing this all alone. We are doing it all together.

Called to walk the way of the cross

AVIAN INFLUENZA (Bird Flu)

On 17th October 2022 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared by the Government across the whole of England. This was because of the increased number of cases of the disease across the country.

All bird keepers (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard) are now required by law to take a range of precautions to protect their flocks. (Jeyes fluid is a Defra approved disinfectant for Avian Influenza).

There are minimum requirements for all bird keepers to follow. If your birds are not housed, they must be kept in fenced / enclosed outdoor areas. Precautions include (amongst others): feeding birds under cover where wild birds cannot access, preventing access by captive birds to ponds and watercourses, and effectively cleansing and disinfecting any hardstanding surfaces in areas where birds are kept.

Further enhanced measures apply for premises with over 500 poultry or other captive birds.

Remember that if you have poultry/captive birds it is your responsibility to keep updated on any outbreaks and an easy way to do this is by signing up for text notifications – register with the APHA alerts service.

If you have any concerns about the health of your birds, you should promptly speak to your vet.

The risk to public health from the virus is very low, however it is important that people don't pick up sick or dead birds. You can report finding dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese or ducks) or other dead wild birds, such as birds of prey, to the DEFRA helpline on 03459 335577.

INTERVIEW - We heat, you eat

The Benefice of Street, Walton and Compton Dundon is one of the churches living out Bishop Michael's charge, offering a warm space and food to those in need. Rector Ana Lawrence explains.



How did 'We heat, you eat' come about?

We wanted to respond practically to the 'cost of living crisis' in our local community. 'We heat, you eat' is a great way of using our building to do just this.

What are you offering?

Every Saturday, from 11.00am to 3.00pm, we can offer a warm and comfortable building, free wifi and parking, disabled access and easy pedestrian routes from the centre of Street. There are comfy chairs and the space to spend time either chatting, playing games or simply find a quiet corner to work or do homework.

What about the food?

Will also be offering a simple hot meal, with guests invited to pay what they can as a donation to cover costs, but there will be no obligation to pay.

Who is it for?

The invitation is open to everyone, not just those who go to church regularly. People can come as often as they want and are welcome to stay for as long they like; they can pop in for half an hour, or the whole afternoon if they wish.

How do you see 'We heat, you eat' developing?

In the future we hope to be able to offer other things our guests need and want including possibly craft activities or a Saturday film.

Many churches are opening their doors for those struggling with their heating bills. Find out more at bathandwells.org.uk/warm-spaces.

Do you still cook Sunday roasts?

It seems that one in five of us feel we can no longer afford to use the oven for that length of time, and so we use our microwaves for other meals instead.

A recent poll by the BBC has found that soaring energy costs are influencing our kitchen habits, with 23 per cent of us saying we use the oven and hob much less than we did.

And nearly 19 per cent of us are opting for meals that are faster to cook.

Meanwhile, 34 per cent of us say we have stopped buying takeaways, and 31 percent of us are eating out less often.



Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or Advocate for children in Somerset.

These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable children and young people. (Travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed.)

You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent Visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend time with a child or young person who is in the care of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitor service.

In Somerset our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.

What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to



children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings. Why not join our bank of advocates? You chose when you're available.

Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability. Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills.

Red, white, rose, and now also sparkling are the single estate wines produced from their grapes. The resulting colour of the wine and alcohol content is determined by the way the grapes are pressed. Flavour is influenced by the amount and intensity of sun on the grapes and timing of picking. All of their wine is from the 4000 Pinot Noir and Chardonnay vines. They work with help from volunteers (which is mutually beneficial) as they have a small profit margin. It's possible to arrange to visit the vineyard, and this may be a trip we do next year.




