From the Rectory

Events follow events. Some we can predict long in advance and some just come suddenly and unexpectedly. No sooner had the coronation with all its celebrations passed than the floods came.

A number of our villages and other neighbouring villages were badly affected. There was mud and debris left on the street when the flood waters had subsided. The ground floors of some properties were ruined and needed to be gutted.

People had to be evacuated by boat by the Fire Brigade and stay with neighbours. Some may not be able to return to their properties for months and are needing to find temporary accommodation. Others have lost valuable items.

And the floods came as a shock. The waters rose all of a sudden as streams burst their banks.

But many have commented on the community spirit shown in our villages and how much this has meant to them. People have rallied round clearing up the streets and offering accommodation and other items to those who need them.

And what was my own experience? I was in a small car, trying to get two young children and myself safely home to North Cadbury. Both main routes in had become impassable.

So what were we to do? My first



thought was 'Who do I know?' We too experienced the kindness and generosity of our community as we took refuge in our local farm shop whose owners we knew.

We were incredibly grateful for this safe haven. But how were we going to get home? Outside tractors were offering lifts and I am sure that we would have been 'up' for this. But before our turn came we were told that we could follow a truck going back to North Cadbury through the lanes round Yarlington and Woolston.

And with a few difficult moments, such as a puncture which started about a mile from home and where our tyre pressure just about held out, we were able to get home.

So we too were thankful that we live in such a supportive community and we do value this.

And as well as recognising the importance of community, I also found myself very grateful for God's provision. There had been just enough tyre pressure to get us home and that might not have been the case if it had happened any earlier.

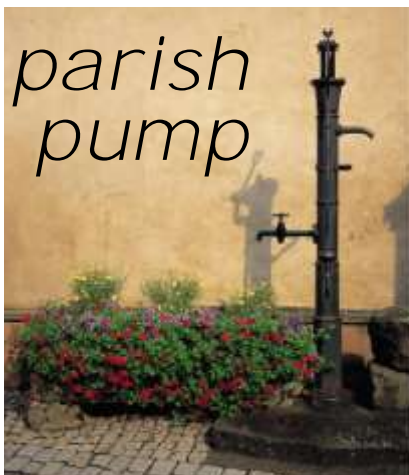

150 years ago, on 5th June 1873, the great slave market in Zanzibar (now part of Tanzania) was closed after Britain issued Sultan Barghash bin Said with an ultimatum to close it or face a blockade.

75 years ago, from 24th June 1948 to 12th May 1949, the Berlin Airlift took place. The Soviet Union began a rail, road and canal blockade of Berlin, cutting off all routes between West Germany and West Berlin. The Allies launched a massive airlift – over 200,000 flights – to take in nearly 9,000 tons of supplies each day.

A Little More Exercise

A recent study suggests that for every additional 500 steps you take each day, you may be lowering the risk of heart issues by 14 per cent.

To put it another way, this recent study found that adults who took fewer than 2,000 steps a day were 77 per cent more likely to experience a cardiovascular event in the following three years than those who took about 4,500 steps a day.

"We were surprised to find that every additional quarter of a mile, or 500 steps, of walking had such a strong benefit to heart health," said one professor of epidemiology at the University of Alabama. "While we do not want to diminish the importance of higher intensity physical activity, encouraging small increases in the number of daily steps also has significant cardiovascular benefits."

From the Bishop

‘Your Majesty, as children of the kingdom of God we welcome you in the name of the King of kings’. In reply to these opening words at his Coronation, King Charles III responded ‘In his name and after his example I come not to be served but to serve.’ This short exchange summed up what the service was about and what it intended to convey.

The King’s commitment to service is not in any doubt. To give just a few examples, he has engaged with our most challenged communities far more than any politician, he called on us to care for the environment years before it became popular to do so and, of course, founded The Prince’s Trust, which supports our most challenged younger people in so many ways.

He becomes king of a new era, the Carolean era. Our times see us face some big challenges. Our question is how to address them. I was immensely struck by all the agencies and charities present in the Abbey for the King’s Coronation. Their participation spoke of the ways in which we’re going to need to act differently in the years ahead to address the issues that confront us.



Because it’s all too evident that the power of government, be that local or national, to respond to the problems we see is less now than it was when the late Queen began her reign. Our challenge in this era is of how we’re going to come together, in service, to address the different challenges that lie before us, be that the climate, how we tackle poverty, how we respond to a troubled international situation. All of us will have a part to play.

Where to find the resource to act in the way that’s going to be needed? As I stood beside the King at the Coronation what inspired me was to see the way he drew so much strength, purpose and resolve and assurance from his Christian faith for the service he’s called to give. And in that we can follow him too.

INTERVIEW - Growing in faith together

Rachel Shaw is Zambia Link Coordinator in Keynsham Parish, which has a link with Chipata South in Eastern Zambia.



Keynsham Zambia Linkers

What prompted your church to establish a link?

We restarted our link to Zambia when Bath and Wells celebrated 40 years of the link in 2022 and I was fortunate enough to go on the diocesan anniversary trip and spent some time getting to know the people there. There are a lot of parallels between our parish and Chipata South, both have a mix of town and rural churches and are busy and thriving communities.

How did you get started?

We have a link group in both places. Together we worked out what we wanted to support and how we wanted to do things. Since we began, we have been clear that the link is about getting to know the people and growing in faith together.

How do you manage that?

Our main challenge is to share with our congregation what life is like in Zambia. We share stories on our Facebook page, hold Zambia evenings and have a WhatsApp Friendship Group of about 40 people, half from Keynsham and half from Zambia.

Have you learnt anything from your link relationship?

It has helped us stop being so focused on money and what we can't do. We can see what they do with so little - and with such faith, joy and hopefulness. We can learn so much from that.

So what's next?

We're organising a teacher exchange with two schools in Keynsham, who are forming their own links with Chipata South School. We hope to fly two teachers from Zambia over here to spend a couple of weeks in school - which will be both beneficial for the teachers and children.

Justin Martyr

Justin Martyr (c. 100 – 165), is regarded as the first ever Christian philosopher. He was born at Nablus, Samaria, to parents of Greek origin, and was well educated in rhetoric, poetry and history before he turned to philosophy. He studied at Ephesus and Alexandria and tried the schools of the Stoics, the Pythagoreans, and the Platonists. Then in c 130 Justin became a Christian, and never looked back. His long search for truth was satisfied by the Bible, and above all by Christ, the Word of God.

He went on to offer a reasoned defence for Christianity, explaining that it was the

UK Foodbanks Busier Than Ever

More food parcels were given out in the UK this past year than ever before. During December 2022, an emergency food parcel was handed out the equivalent of every eight seconds. These are the most recent figures from the Trussell Trust, which supports more than 1,300 foodbanks in the UK.

In all, the charity says it gave out nearly three million food parcels between April 2022 and April 2023. More than one million of these were for children.

These three million parcels from the charity's foodbanks represent a 37-per-cent increase in England on 2021. And more

than 760,000 people used a foodbank for the first time, which is up more than one third on 2021-22.

Soaring inflation and energy costs have driven the increase in demand. The charity reports an unprecedented rise in the number of employed people using their foodbanks, because they are “no longer able to balance a low income against rising living costs.”

The problem now, says the trust, is that food donation levels are not keeping up with the need. “This is putting us under a lot of strain.”

fulfilment of the Old Testament prophecies. Justin's aim was evangelism: he thought that pagans would turn to Christianity if they were made aware of Christian doctrine and practice.

Justin's martyrdom took place in the reign of Marcus Aurelius, along with six other believers. At his trial, whose authentic record survives, he clearly confessed his Christian beliefs, refused to sacrifice to the gods, and accepted suffering and death. As he had previously said to the emperor: “You can kill us, but not hurt us.”

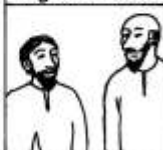
