From the Rectory

What word describes the ministry of Jesus Christ? Compassion might be an obvious choice. Jesus never ignored the needs of others, but gave costly and effective help to those in need.

Grace might be another strong candidate. We can sometimes ask whether those in need deserve our help. Jesus, however, helped those who least deserved it, social and religious outcasts. He even chose to share a dinner table with many of them.

This is grace in action. However, not everyone was happy. The Pharisees, for instance, insisted that keeping the law matters and instead of welcoming these people, Jesus should be insisting that God's standards should be strictly upheld.

There is an opposition between these two principles of grace and law. I wonder what comes to mind when we think of each of them. Here are two more stories about cars, following on from last month's account of my car being caught in the floods.

The first concerns a holiday in Cornwall. At the end of a long, tiring day, we stopped off at the supermarket for some provisions and for petrol.

But the car refused to start again. The dashboard indicated a serious problem. The supermarket and petrol station were busy, crowded



places full of people wanting to get on with their own lives. Who would help us? We were desperate to get home.

And then a man filling up with petrol nearby appeared at our window. He happened to be an expert mechanic and he was able to get the car to start.

He offered his help cheerfully and ungrudgingly. On talking to him, we found out that he was a Christian missionary. Yes, we thought, this is grace in action.

And then, by contrast, I was driving to our local hospital a couple of days after the birth of our second daughter. Mother and baby needed to be seen immediately by the medical staff. I and our other young daughter, anxious about her mother and baby sister, had to wait in the car. But we were only allowed to wait outside the hospital for a limited time. Did we wait or drive off to park elsewhere?

We waited a few minutes too long. The closed circuit television camera took note. A fine arrived in the post shortly afterwards. Yes, this was correct but it seemed to take no

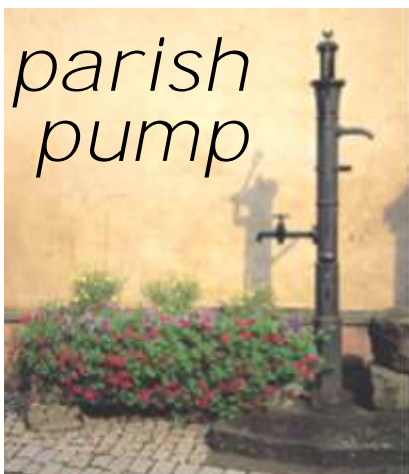

encourage me to pass grace on to
others. But if I think about the
impact of law, I will become resentful
and embittered.

I am sure we can all think of
incidents both of grace and of law in
our lives. Which will we choose to
remember?

From the Bishop

'In response to God's immense love for us we seek to be God's people living and telling the story of Jesus.' INTERVIEW - A witness of my faith

Bryan Wong is a School Foundation Governor at St Andrew's Church School, Bath.



Why did you become a governor?

I wanted to support the school and I wanted to serve God. I also wanted to help the students here in the school.

What's the best thing about being a governor?

The best thing is fulfilment. To be involved in the school governing body and to chair committees, to support the leadership of the school, to visit the students and see how they're doing in class - all these are very, very meaningful to me.

Does it take up all your spare time?

No. I find my colleagues and the school leadership very understanding. They keep reminding me that I need to put my family first. So, if I cannot finish the meeting because

I need to pick up my child then I will be excused.

What would you say to someone who's thinking of becoming a governor?

I think it's a very meaningful job. Apart from serving the community, it keeps me very up to date with the knowledge and dynamic development about the education system in this country. I feel inclusivity and diversity are very much celebrated here and that helps me to make better sense of how this could be translated into other spheres of my life.

How did your faith inform your decision to become a governor?

My faith was actually the cornerstone of my decision to join the governing body. I was invited by the former headteacher here. It was approved by my parish council. So I always see my role here as a foundation governor as also a witness of my faith to the school community. This is to me the most important thing.

How to keep young as you grow old

When the US President Joe Biden announced that he was running for re-election, many of us thought he was too old. He will be 86 by the end of 2028. Trump will be 82. How could either of them run the United States at such an age?

The argument about Biden and Trump will doubtless carry on, but meanwhile, there is some encouragement for the rest of us who are ageing.

A 2012 study by the University of Edinburgh found that only about a quarter of the cognitive changes that occur as we age are determined by genetics. The other three quarters are based on our lifestyle choices.

Firstly, choose to exercise. When you exercise in any way, you are not just making your body fit, you are also improving your brain health.

This is because exercise promotes the release of a cell-making protein in the brain called BDNF (brain-derived neurotrophic factor), which is linked to learning and memory.

Secondly, choose to retain a sense of control and purpose in your life. We can't all influence world politics, but we can each of us can act for the general good of the people around us.

In 2022, researchers in the US found that people who have a greater sense of purpose in life not only live longer, but have fewer health problems, including depression, blood pressure problems and heart attacks.

Thirdly, choose to set yourself some realistic personal goals, no matter how small.

Research shows that setting a goal – even just to lose weight, or tidy the garden, can make you feel immediately more worthwhile.

Fourthly, choose to keep spending time with other people. Remaining sociable in old age is vital – we are social animals and really do need those meaningful relationships.

Fifthly, choose to follow activities that allow you to keep learning – perhaps take up a hobby such as gardening, or even begin a foreign language.



Over the last few weeks our children have been diligently working their way through a myriad of statutory external examinations and tests to show the extent of their learning in primary school. Our Year 6 children (10 & 11 year olds) sat the much discussed SATS papers amidst thunder, lightning and floods!

Our Year 2 children (6 & 7 year olds) were equally unphased by their SATS papers and our Year 4 children (8 & 9 year olds) were incredibly relaxed during their Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). How would you compare? Well, we thought you might like to try . . .

You need to answer 25 questions, and for each question you have just six seconds, and in that time you would have to input the answer into a device, but good old fashioned pen and paper would do :o)

On your marks, get set, go.

Our building work is coming along nicely, and we are hoping that the dry weather continues so that we can be in for the new term in September. Supporting our Schools

In Bath and Wells we are blessed to have 182 Church of England schools. While they each support their children in their own unique way, their values are underpinned by the Church of England's values of wisdom, hope, community and dignity. Supporting our schools with their own unique talents are our school governors.

Ed Gregory, Director of Education for Bath and Wells, says, "Governors are an essential part of the leadership team in a school or trust. You don't need to be an expert in education, the strength of a governing board comes from skills and experiences each person brings. While we have some amazingly supportive governors, we also have many gaps to fill, particularly Foundation Governors and Trustees, so if you feel this is something you are called to do, why not find out more about how you could help? It doesn't take much of your time, we provide lots of support and I have no doubt you will find it extremely rewarding."

Headteacher Jayne Rochford-Smith, St Andrew's Church School, Bath, says, "Governors are what I would call

'critical friends'. They bring advice, they help us to move the school forward, and they also help us to make the right decisions."

Foundation Governors are appointed as Governors and as 'Champions' for the preservation and development the religious character of our Church of England schools, a responsibility of the entire Governing Board. They can be from any walk of life and any age, over 18, and be a practising Anglican or a member of another Christian denomination within the Churches Together movement. If you'd like to be a governor, even if you don't have a current church connection, if you have the support of the school and church community and are passionate about ensuring that the religious character of the school is flourishing, we'd still be keen to talk to you so get in touch.

St Willibald

St. Willibald (d. 786) was one of the most widely travelled Anglo-Saxons of his time. He began life in Wessex, becoming a monk at Bishops Waltham in Hampshire. But he obviously had the curiosity that besets all keen travellers – wondering what was over the next hill.

And so Willibald set out ... for Rome, Cyprus, Syria and above all, Palestine. It was an amazing achievement, just to survive such journeys back in the early 8th century.

In Palestine, Willibald made his way round all the Holy Places associated with Jesus, as well as the numerous communities of monks and hermits living there.

After a two-year stay in Constantinople, the year 730 found Willibald back in Italy, where he settled at the monastery at Monte Cassino. Under his reforming influence, the monastery began to prosper. That got Willibald 'noticed', and soon Boniface asked Pope Gregory III to send Willibald to assist with his missionary work in Germany.

Willibald founded a monastery at Eichstatt that became an important centre for the diffusion and development of monasticism. Boniface made Willibald Bishop of Eichstatt in 746 where he remained until he died in 787.

At the end of his life, Willibald dictated an account of all his travels to a long-suffering nun, Huneburg, – the first ever travel book to be written by an Anglo-Saxon.

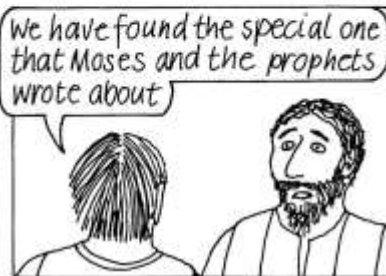
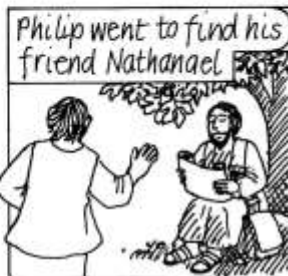

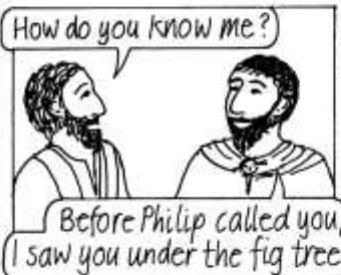
