# From the Rectory

How many answers to prayers have you experienced? With so many weddings taking place in our benefice in the summer, I am sometimes (perhaps not totally seriously) expected to have a special 'line' to God which will result in just the right kind of weather on the day.

Having said that, however, a member of one family who was involved in a wedding was known to be a person of firm faith. Others were not so sure and when the weather forecast for the day was pretty grim, they turned to this person and said 'Well, you do something about this.' Quite calmly, he said to them 'Everything will be all right.' And indeed, this was how it turned out. When I was taking the wedding inside the church the skies opened in a downpour that seemed as if it was going to last all day. And yet there was no rain either on the bride's entrance into church or on the procession of bride and groom out of church at the end of service. Indeed, by the time of the reception the sun was shining brightly.

Sometimes we need to persist in prayer even when apparently our prayers are not being answered. A recent gospel reading that we have heard in church illustrates this. It concerns a Canaanite woman who simply would not give up in her prayers to Jesus for the healing of her daughter. Despite all the obstacles in her way, she simply refused to give



up. And in the end her persistence is rewarded as her daughter is indeed healed.

This is a powerful reminder that we should never give up in our prayers. But what if, despite our persistence, we still receive no answers to our prayers? What, for instance, about those times when we have asked God for healing and our requests are not granted?

It is here that we need to remember the dimension of our Christian faith which insists that there is more to life than we are able to experience in the here and now. God's purposes are larger than we can possibly imagine and, in the end, total healing lies beyond this life. As the last book in the Bible, the book of Revelation promises us, God has a future for us in which all the imperfections of our present life will have passed away. There every prayer will be answered and 'death, mourning, crying and pain will be no more' (Revelation 21: 4).



## Fish May Help You Hear

Seafood, and oily fish in particular, may be able to help you hear better. A new study has found evidence that consuming oily fish such as sardines, salmon and mackerel may help slow down the onset of deafness.

Scientists at the University of Guelph, in Canada, found that people with particularly

high blood levels of DHA, found in seafood which is rich in omega-3 fatty acids, were 16 per cent less likely to have difficulty hearing, compared with those who had low levels.

Scientists believe that the DHA may play an important role in signal transmissions between nerve cells, including the auditory nerves of the ear.

Some scientists suggest that we consider eating fatty fish at least three times a week, in order to increase our blood levels of DHA. This need not be expensive: according to the Cleveland Clinic, in the US, sardines – a tin of which cost just 47p at Tesco – contain some of the highest levels of omega-3 of any fish.

## From the Bishop

When you hear the word 'disciple', what comes into your mind? A learner? A follower? A super Christian? Someone kitted out in Biblical dress complete with robe, sandals, tea towel head covering and beard?

The New Testament's word for disciple doesn't quite match any of these descriptions. It's much closer to the word we'd use in English for 'apprentice'.

Back in history, and still today,

to be an apprentice meant spending time in the presence of a master in order to learn a craft – maybe carpentry, or blacksmithing, baking or butchery. You'd start out doing the simple stuff – sweeping floors or sharpening

tools. Then gradually you'd acquire more and more skills until you learnt to work confidently with materials producing beautiful things, products of utility and worth. Apprentices often learnt their craft while living alongside their masters, becoming members of their trade through time spent together at work and rest and play.

Jesus was often called 'the carpenter's son' – apprenticed to his worldly father Joseph, growing in skill at the plane and the lathe. He was also the apprentice of his heavenly father. The Gospels speak of Jesus



withdrawing to spend time with God in order to know God's mind, hear God's voice, grow in God's ways.

Apprenticeship was and is a story of growth, development, discovery and change. It's the journey that Jesus invites us to take with him too – of baby steps and toddler stumbles, of emerging skill and increasing understanding.

Churches near you are offering opportunities to apprentice yourself to Jesus this autumn - from practical action that gets you involved in Jesus's service to the world, to learning and discussion that comes with courses such as Alpha, Exploring Christianity or Pilgrim.

Why not sign yourself up and learn from the Master?

# **INTERVIEW** -Encouraged in faith

Dr Marjay Pallant, All Saints, Trull talks about growing as a Christian thanks to her membership of Small Groups.



# What's your experience of Small Groups?

As a student I was dipping into church on Sunday with friends. They invited me to join their Small Group meeting and I found I was learning more in that group. As my faith matured I started paying attention on Sundays a bit more, but have continued to attend Small Groups ever since.

# What's your current Small Group like?

We meet for dinner every Wednesday then have a bit of worship, Bible

study and prayer. Normally 10 young adults attend. I feel we enjoy a greater sense of community as you see people for more than just a 'Hi!' after a Sunday service. The time and continuity allows for a bit more of an in-depth relationship and ongoing prayer.

#### How not to be a Grumpy Old Man (or Woman)

#### Michael and All Angels 29<sup>th</sup> September

What is an angel? Easy, people think: a shining figure with glorious wings, who appears from time to time to do some mighty work for God or bring a very special message from him.

Well, that's right in one sense (apart from the wings, which owe more to stained glass windows than the Bible). But not all 'angels' in the Bible are 'glorious' or 'shining'. For example, the three apparently ordinary men who visited Abraham and Sarah to tell them that she would have a son even though she was long past child-bearing age had none of those outward embellishments. Nevertheless, Abraham recognised them as divine messengers.

The Bible is full of angels, from the early chapters of Genesis to the last chapter of Revelation, and often they had a key role in crucial events. It seems, from just two instances, that Michael was their leader, an 'archangel'. In many stained glass windows he's seen with a sword, because in a vision in Revelation he led the angelic host who fought and defeated Satan and his army.

In the Gospels, an angel of the Lord appeared to Zechariah in the Temple, to tell him that his elderly wife was to have a son, the forerunner of the Messiah, John the Baptist. An angel, Gabriel, appeared to Mary to tell her that she would be the mother of the Messiah, the Son of God. An angel appeared 'in a dream' to Joseph, the village carpenter in Nazareth, to tell him to go ahead and marry his fiance, Mary, and later – also in a dream – warned him not to go back to Bethlehem. A 'young man', whom we take to have been an angel, was sitting in the empty tomb on Easter morning, waiting to tell the startled

women that Jesus wasn't there – He had risen (Mark 16:5).

Without going into every biblical reference to angels, those should be sufficient to show that the word covers an enormous diversity of experience. So the Letter to the Hebrews speaks of those who practice hospitality as sometimes 'entertaining angels unawares'. Sometimes people recognised angels for who they were, and sometimes they didn't. Angels, quite simply, are God's agents or emissaries, messengers and ministers of His will. Sometimes they appear as human; sometimes they seem to be spiritual beings.

Perhaps we could even say that *anyone*, in any situation, who is at that moment God's 'messenger' to us, or serves us graciously, is an 'angel'. So, when we say, 'Oh, be an angel and pop up to the chemist for my prescription', we may be nearer the heart of the matter than we think!
