### From the Rectory

I must have been pressing the wrong button on my computer because recently, presumably encouraged by Artificial Intelligence, a number of optical illusions have been appearing on my newsfeed. I look at them and this only encourages more to appear.

The illusion takes the form of a single picture which conceals two radically different images. The question is which image you see first. For instance, do you see a sheep or a mountain? You probably see what you are predisposed to see. This is why your answer is supposed to give some deep clue as vour to personality.

I have to admit that in my own case the answers to this test have been pretty hit and miss. Sometimes, the personality analyses have been largely accurate, sometimes sort of accurate, sometimes either image could fit me equally well and there are occasions when I can make no sense of the analysis at all.

However, what these illusions do demonstrate is how two people can experience precisely the same set of events and yet report what they have 'seen' in radically different and even opposing ways. Your experience depends, in part, on what you are looking for in the first place.

In a church or in any community for that matter we will come across people who have radically different



ways of responding to shared experiences. How do we deal with that? Sadly, there seems to be an increasing tendency in our world to 'cancel' people who have different views from ourselves and to pretend that they do not exist.

Surely, however, there must be a better way than that. The epistles of the New Testament speak about the Christian need for patience and forbearance. The famous description of love in the letter to the Corinthians tells us that love is patient and that it bears all things. Similarly, other epistles also speak of patience and bearing with one another in love.

If we are to do this effectively, then this means trying to see life from the perspective of another person. We may not end up agreeing with their views but, by 'walking in their shoes' we can grow in our understanding of how they see life. And who knows perhaps the next time we look at that picture it will yield more than we first thought and we will see both the sheep and the mountain.



### Ukrainians Request More Bibles

The war in Ukraine has led to a dramatic rise in the demand for Bibles, as people ask existential questions about life and death.

The Ukrainian Bible Society reports that, in the last 15 months, some 700,000 Bibles have been distributed across the war-torn country. This is a five-fold increase on numbers handed out before the war. In 2020, some 136,767 Bibles were distributed in Ukraine.

Anatoliy Raychynets, deputy general secretary of the Ukrainian Bible Society explains, "The experience of this time is that so many people are looking for Bibles and churches.

"We are doing everything possible to reach all the needs, but more Bibles are needed. With the help of the Word of God, we can bring the love of God to those who need it."

Bibles are distributed around the country, including to soldiers and civilian communities on the front line, and to those in hospital. "Wherever the Bible is taken, it is very much appreciated," said Anatoliy.

### From the Bishop

This week I was on a Zoom chat with some of our chaplains around the diocese. I meet regularly with eight or nine of them alongside our Chaplaincy Development Adviser Mike Haslam. These are only a few of the more than 300 chaplains we have, of all ages, lay and ordained, across Bath and Wells.

There are more and more enquiries about chaplaincy from a wide range of communities. They are seeking a chaplain to offer pastoral care and well-being support for an increasingly stressed and anxious workforce. One

particular enquiry caught my attention this week.

A local Further

Education college has been saying that their first concern is for a chaplain to address the spiritual exploration of its students. What an opportunity! We know from the Talking Jesus research (2015 and 2022) that most practising Christians come to faith before the age of 18. Several of our schools, including primary, have pupil chaplains now and this is a great way of recognising that you are never too young to start in living and telling the story of Jesus!

As a child I was always struck by the Old Testament story of the unnamed little slave girl who served Naaman's wife, (2 Kings chapter 5). Taken from her home to another country, and



placed in an alien environment, she was the one who introduced Naaman to Elisha the prophet in Israel. As a result, Naaman overcame his scepticism, was healed from his leprosy, and discovered a faith in God.

> Chaplaincy opens up a diversity of contexts in which we can share our faith and I invite you to pray for those here in Bath and

Wells who are treading new ground to open up the way for others to discover the love of Jesus for themselves. However, each one of us has our own possibility of being a chaplain, coming alongside another in our daily life and community. Sometimes our timidity prevents us from speaking up about faith and our personal spiritual journey other than in church where we are known and on familiar territory. How about taking some time to reflect on where you might live and tell the story of Jesus outside of church, in your everyday context? Is there someone, like a Naaman's wife who is desperate to find help and hope for a loved one

but doesn't know where to find it? Maybe you are the only one who could tell them!

### INTERVIEW -God's Representative

The Revd Katy Garner, former Rector of Backwell with Chelvey and Brockley, talks chaplaincy ahead of her licensing as Chaplain at Bath Spa University.



# What prompted the move from parish ministry?

I just felt that this is where God was calling me to be, despite the fact that Backwell is a very exciting place to be right now and is growing in spirituality.

#### Why university chaplaincy?

You could say I am very comfortable in a student setting. After a career in nursing, and a five- year gap to have a family, I decided to get a degree. A year of Open University study, a three year degree at the University of the West of England, a PhD and a period as a Post Doc at Bristol University followed.

# What do you think university chaplaincy offers?

Universities offer students a most exciting part of their education – they are set free, on their own, and for some that's an amazing and lifegiving experience, but for a lot of people it can be very difficult and they need support.

#### How will you offer support?

As this is a new role, it will first be about journeying with students and staff and determining how chaplaincy can feature in this university. There is a secret garden with a fire pit, and I can have an allotment, so there's a lot of potential for activities that tie in caring for creation, and therefore ourselves. I'll also be taking along my dog as a care dog. As a chaplain you are not necessarily talking about God, but I absolutely view myself as God's representative in that place.

#### What are you looking forward to?

Ministering to this diverse, creative bunch of individuals is going to be really exciting and a real blessing for me. I hope I can become someone they can know and feel confident about to coming to with any problems, but also to share their joys.

#### Is now a good time to grow old?

"Don't grow old," a parishioner of advanced years warned me some while back. "You won't like it."

Sadly, that dear woman is no longer with us, and I'm a whole lot older than when she offered me that kind advice. But was there wisdom in her words?

It's true that generally people are living longer and in better health than in generations before, but there are increasing challenges for older men and women in our society.

My friend, Maggie Dodd is an 'Anna Chaplain' for older people. She is one of around 300 such chaplains up and down the country. They spiritually support people – of strong, little or no faith – in care homes, sheltered housing or in their own homes.

Maggie has told me how life is becoming harder for older people, and we've swapped notes on what we have both observed.

She told me: "Some of the basic services older people need are becoming more difficult to access. I hear about doctor's surgeries asking for patients to print out their own forms or send photos to or from smartphones. Banks are phasing out high street branches, pushing everyone towards online banking. Many older people feel very uneasy about going online, worried of being scammed out of their savings.

"A trip to the shops is also becoming more complicated. Checkouts in supermarkets are increasingly self-service. Mobility can also be affected as car parks often need an app to be uploaded onto a smartphone to park. In many car parks there is no option to pay by card or cash!"

Plans to remove the ticket offices at train stations will make matters worse for many older would-be rail travellers.

Maggie told me "This gradual marginalisation of people can leave them feeling lonely and isolated. Loneliness can have a huge detrimental effect on health and wellbeing. Prolonged social isolation and loneliness are the equivalent of smoking 15 cigarettes a day."

It's good that many churches run special events and activities for older people, as well as groups for all ages. But is this enough? Christians are called to follow Christ's example and speak out for at risk of being marginalised in our society.

Today, that could be our older brothers and sisters.

#### William Tyndale, Bible translator

October 29<sup>th</sup> is Bible Sunday and October 6<sup>th</sup> is the anniversary of the death of William Tyndale who gave his life to translate the Bible into English.

William Tyndale was born around 1494 near Gloucester, and studied at Oxford and Cambridge. He could speak seven languages, and was proficient in ancient Hebrew and Greek. As a priest, his abilities would have taken him a long way, but by 1523 Tyndale's only desire was to translate the Bible, so that English men and women could read it for themselves. It became his life's passion.

Tyndale had been inspired by reading Erasmus' Greek edition of the New Testament. In fact, his life's work was well summed up in the words of his mentor, Erasmus: "Christ desires His mysteries to be published abroad as widely as possible. I would that [the Gospels and the epistles of Paul] were translated into all languages, of all Christian people, and that they might be read and known."

Tyndale's translation was the first Bible to be published in English, the first to draw directly from Hebrew and Greek texts, and the first English translation to take advantage of the printing press.

It was to cost him his life. For Tyndale's work was seen as a direct challenge to the power of both the Roman Catholic Church and the laws of England in maintaining the Church's position.

When the authorities had tried to stop his translation, Tyndale fled to Hamburg, Wittenberg, Cologne, and finally to the Lutheran city of Worms. It was there, in 1525, his New Testament emerged. It was quickly smuggled into England, and King Henry VIII, Cardinal Wolsey, and others, were furious.

Tyndale moved on to Antwerp, where for nine more years he continued his work. Then in May 1535 he was betrayed, arrested, and jailed in a castle near Brussels. Tied to the stake for strangulation and burning, his dying prayer was that the King of England's eyes would be opened. Sure enough, two years later King Henry authorised the Great Bible for the Church of England, which relied largely on Tyndale's work.

Not only that, but in 1611, the 54 scholars who produced the King James Bible drew very heavily from Tyndale. Even today we honour him: in 2002, Tyndale was placed at number 26 in the BBC's poll of 100 Greatest Britons.

90 years ago, on 17<sup>th</sup> October 1933, physicist Albert Einstein arrived in the USA as a refugee from Nazi Germany.

75 years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> October 1948, the Morris Minor car was launched at the British Motor Show at Earl's Court in London. It cost £358.

70 years ago, on 30<sup>th</sup> October 1953, former US Secretary of State George Marshall was awarded the 1953 Nobel Peace Prize for engineering the Marshall Plan – a massive economic aid programme for Europe in the aftermath of WWII.

65 years ago, on 1<sup>st</sup> October 1958, Michael Bond's children's book A Bear Called Paddington was published. It marked the debut appearance of Paddington Bear.

40 years ago, on 25<sup>th</sup> October 1983, Microsoft Word 1.0 was released. It was the first version of the popular word processor, and Microsoft's first full-featured application.

Also 40 years ago, on 5<sup>th</sup> October 1983, Lech Walesa, leader of the Solidarity movement in Poland (and later President of Poland) was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

30 years ago, on 15<sup>th</sup> October 1993, South African leaders Nelson Mandela and F.W. de Klerk, won the 1993 Nobel Peace Prize for their efforts to end apartheid.

25 years ago, on 16<sup>th</sup> October 1998, David Trimble and John Hume won the 1998 Nobel Peace Prize for brokering the Northern Ireland peace accord.
