

From the Rectory

As we look around the at international scene at the moment. we can see a number of disturbing developments which challenge our capacity to look at them through the eyes of faith and hope. Perhaps we ourselves are facing personal crises of which the same could also be said. And even the bleakness of the weather at this time of year does not help.

In church we have just come into the season of Lent. Our readings last Sunday examined how Jesus was both tempted but also tested in the wilderness. Without any human companionship and with only the wild beasts around him, he endured both the devil's temptations and also the testing conditions of the wilderness with its lack of any sustaining resources or nourishment.

In such circumstances, Jesus was entirely dependent on God and the provision of God's angels for help. However, He could look back to the wonderful affirmation of His baptism where the heavens opened and God's voice declared that He was God's beloved Son. And He could also look forward to the promise of the fruitful ministry that God had in store for Him.


Thinking about this pattern, I was reminded about the renovation works on the property which our family is due to move into on my retirement. When we started and were about to



apply for planning permission, I remember an architect friend of ours saying that this was a very exciting time when we were just drawing up all our plans. However, she warned us that there would be a long period in the middle when we would wonder why we had ever embarked on this project!

We are now just about getting to the stage where we can see the work being completed. However, the time through which we have come has certainly been a testing one and when there are just piles of rubble around in the various rooms and walls that have been knocked down, the words about wondering why we had started on this certainly rang true with us.

For, when times are testing, we can all find it a challenge to meet them with faith and hope. But, if we are able to do so, then we find that these tests also strengthen and refine us.



YMCA British Boys for British Farms 9th Reunion

The YMCA British Boys for British Farms 9th Reunion will be taking place at North Cadbury Court on Thursday 23rd May 2024. The Montgomery family kindly allowed the YMCA to have up to 30 boys, aged 14 – 16 mainly from the inner cities, to stay at North Cadbury Court while they worked for eight to twelve weeks on local farms from 1950 to 1966.

This Reunion will be the third Reunion to be held at North Cadbury Court. The first reunion was held in May 2014 at North Cadbury Court and we had BBC Countryfile filming over two or three days, in June 2014 they showed 15 minutes on TV.

The YMCA BBBF Farm Training scheme started in 1932 to 1968, at different times during those years, there were 14 YMCA BBBF hostels across England and more than 20,000 boys went through this farm training scheme.



From the Bishop

Sowing seeds, chitting potatoes, choosing varieties. Easter acts as starter's orders for the gardening Beds are cultivated, lawns vear. mown, plans for all the growth and new life that spring and summer will bring made and then turned into action.

There's a much greater connection between gardening and Easter than it merely being the time to dust off forks and spades. For in the Bible, a garden is the setting for Easter itself. In John's Gospel (John 20: 1-18) Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in a garden. Indeed, Jesus's appearance to Mary is so unexpected that at first she can't believe it's really him. So she mistakes the man she meets 'supposing him be gardener' (John 20: 15).

In John's account, all the new life contained in the first Easter chimes with a much earlier story set in a garden too. This is of the new life of another man and woman, creation story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and contained in the book of Genesis (Genesis 2:4- 3:24). In that story, Adam is the gardener (Gen 2: 15), only for things to go wrong. In John, Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam - come to bring new life that has no end.

What would happen if we were to think of our churches as gardens, primed to welcome the spring that is the new life of Jesus this Easter? What would happen if imagined ourselves called to be gardeners - like

our father Adam and the new Adam. What would we expect to **Jesus?** grow? What might need pruning or weeding? What new plans for the coming season would we make and turn into action? What would be the harvest that we'd sow for, tend and then reap?

For I reckon we should see Easter as the starting point of all that God wants to do among us and with us. Jesus's resurrection opens us to being part of God's new creation. Easter offers us a fresh start for life.

INTERVIEW -A time to reflect



Grant Swarbrooke, Head of Swainswick School in Bath, shares their Easter plans.

How do you mark Easter at your school?

At Swainswick we have two curriculums, our subject curriculum and our Wider Curriculum that focuses on the children's personal development that is centred around our Christian values. This is lived out in our Easter celebration, which the children have got total ownership of.

What is planned this year?

We always have a beautiful music concert that is entwined with Easter. The children will be performing individually and in bands. They will write and perform their own poetry, prayers and readings.

What message do the children take away?

Easter is a time of reflection and the story of Jesus dying on the cross offers us a time to stop and reflect on the sacrifice that Jesus made for us. It also offers us a time to reflect about ourselves, the world around us, and each other.

That is at the centre of our values and our learning. Easter is a lovely way to encourage the children to think about those important things - in this very busy world.

How else do you live out your Christian values?

In our lesson called Future Fridays Our Global discuss Responsibility'. Every Friday the children run a refill shop for the community. and have invited speakers. such Amnesty as International and Red Card Racism.

We've also recently introduced the Archbishop's Young Leaders Award.

What is the award?

It is designed to equip children and young people in character education, to build their leadership skills and faith development, and to empower them to undertake a variety of transformational social action projects in their local communities.

We feel it fits well with the work we are already undertaking at Swainswick.

The Rules of Living Well After 60

The King is 75. Last year he did 516 engagements, and before his recent diagnosis for cancer, he had no intention of slowing down. Instead, he was keen to be 'back up and running' as soon as possible after his prostate operation. Was he right?

"Absolutely he was – you shouldn't slow down," says Sir Muir Gray, 80, former chief knowledge officer for the NHS. "Ageing exists as a normal biological process but until the age of 90, it has little effect on your ability to look after yourself, engage with others or get about independently. In fact, paradoxically, as we get older, we need to become more active – physically and mentally. Ageing doesn't make you feel old – disease and loss of fitness will."

A study from the Yale School of Public Health found that people who had positive ideas about their own ageing ("I have as much pep as last year") lived for an average of 22.6 years after they first participated in the study, while the people who felt less positively about ageing, lived for just 15 years more on average.

Of course, getting older does involve some loss of energy. But slowing down a bit is never something to be ashamed of, and getting enough rest is the very cornerstone of leading a good life.

Exercise is also crucial as we get older. Focus on the four Ss: stamina, strength, skill (balance) and suppleness. Maintain your stamina by brisk walking every day for 30 minutes.

When you are ill, get up again as soon as you reasonably can. Otherwise, you are at risk of 'deconditioning syndrome', a physiological decline where muscle strength can decrease dramatically if you are over 70.

Thoughtfully review of your personal life-balance. Try to find the 'sweet spot' between activity and rest. Gray advises: "If you're only doing activities, you are inevitably going to burn out. But if you only rest, you will become sedentary and you're more likely to fall ill, feel disconnected and lonely."

Finally, don't run on a hamster wheel of someone else's making. This Lent, before God, rethink your real purpose and calling in life. And live it!
