### From the Rectory

As I approach retirement, one question that I am asked is what it is like knowing that you are going to do something for the last time. This is particularly relevant as we approach Holy Week and the immediate run up to Easter.

First of all, what comes to my mind is that everything has a heightened sense of significance. Good Friday and Easter are, of course, always extraordinarily significant times of year. And we can also say that as we enjoy the presence of the risen Christ with us that it is always Easter in our hearts.

And though I may in the future well take part again in leading worship in the Easter period, I know that this will be in a different role and a different place. So, in our church services now as we journey with Jesus towards the Cross and Resurrection, each moment has for me a heightened sense of significance. Rather than thinking or planning how might I do this next time, I am purely concerned with what is happening in the moment. Sometimes, this means that you notice in familiar passages such as the readings for Palm Sunday some detail that previously passed you by.

So, this year, as we follow the readings in Mark's gospel, I have noticed some telling details which are unique to this particular gospel. Why after all the commotion of Palm Sunday does Jesus calmly have a look round the Temple and then decide to go back to Bethany and to bed? The next morning, of course, will be a different matter when



He overturns the moneychangers' tables and cleanses the Temple. But, for now, it seems that He decided just to 'sleep on it'. And why did Jesus promise the owner of the donkey that He would send the donkey back immediately He no longer needed it? What does all this tell us about Jesus?

And perhaps everyday activities also had for Jesus in the last week of His life a heightened sense of significance. At the Last Supper, He knows that this is the last meal that He will eat with His friends. And so, He invests the ordinary, everyday elements of the table, the bread and the wine with an extraordinary power and purpose. This is my body He tells the disciples and this is my blood. For He will no longer eat the Passover with them or drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes (see Luke 22: 18).

And that phrase brings us back to what I said a couple of months ago about an ending being also a new beginning. Yes, in one sense, it is the last time that He will eat with them.



### Don't Hesitate to Use Hearing Aids

Here is something you didn't expect: using hearing aids if you are a bit deaf can be of great benefit to your overall health.

Crystal Rolfe, director of health at the Royal National Institute for Deaf People (RNID) said: "Hearing aids bring enormous benefits for people with hearing loss. Research shows that wearing hearing aids may reduce the risk of cognitive decline, and it is well known that they have positive effects on physical, social, emotional, and mental wellbeing.

According to hearing loss charity RNID, 12 million adults in the UK are deaf, have hearing loss or tinnitus and an estimated seven million people could benefit from hearing aids, but only about two million use them.

The researchers hope the findings, published in The Lancet Healthy Longevity journal, will encourage more people to wear hearing aids. As one doctor said: "If you have hearing loss, get hearing aids. The benefits could be limitless."


### From the Assistant Bishop

In January I was back in my old Diocese of Exeter, marking the death of Sabine Baring Gould 100 years before. What an extraordinary person he was, with an incredible range and roundedness of learning and interests, in an equally full and fulfilled life. He was a great traveller and prolific writer of biographies, folklore, travel books, theology, novels and hymns, including some, such as 'Onward Christian soldiers' that remain popular today. He was a linguist and translator; and, as an archaeologist on Dartmoor, very much a pioneer in the field.

For many, his greatest achievement was his collecting the old folk songs of Devon and Cornwall, providing inspiration for such composers

as Elgar, Vaughan Williams and Holst. He was also the Squire of Lewtrenchard and, being ordained, he appointed himself as parish priest as well!

This he saw as his true vocation. His responsibility, and that of the local church, was the cure of souls from cradle to grave. This meant a care for the spiritual wellbeing of all in the community and for their bodily and social welfare too. Striving for good health and housing must go hand in hand with growth in faith and prayer. All should be encouraged to full humanity, to holy discipleship, to the recognition, and use, of whatever



gifts anyone possessed for the common good.

But, underlying all of this, one other aspect of this great man's life speaks very strongly to me now. That is how he understood worship and its relationship to the whole of life. 'To worship is to quicken the

Worship is key conscience by the holiness of God, to feed the mind with the truth of God, to purge the imagination by the beauty of God, to open the heart to the love of God,

to devote the will to the purpose of God'.

The interview on page 12 is one of several encouraging stories of New Christian Worshipping Communities in the Diocese of Bath and Wells. Worshipping is key. I am reminded of the later words of Archbishop William Temple: 'It is sometimes said that conduct is supremely important, and worship helps it. The truth is that worship is supremely important, and conduct tests it.'

### Wordsearch - St George


St George is Patron Saint of England, but he never actually came here. He was a Christian officer in the Roman army under Diocletian, who refused to abandon his faith during the Terror. George was therefore martyred in Palestine about 300 AD. His courage became legendary, and St George became the example of a Christian fighting-man, a powerful helper against evil powers affecting individual lives. He was the soldier-hero of the Middle Ages.

In the Golden Legend of the 13<sup>th</sup> century, Jacobus de Voragine tells the story of how St George helped rescue the people of Sylene in Libya from a dragon, especially the princess, who had been offered to the dragon as a sacrifice. With the dragon dead, and the princess returned to her father the King, the people of Sylene converted to Christianity.

### INTERVIEW -A shared life of prayer and mission

The Revd Liz Dudley (former Vicar of Castle Cary) with Pioneers Elizabeth and Andrew Alden share plans for a new Christian Community in Frome.



Preparations are underway at Mary's House.

#### What is happening in Frome?

Work is underway at the former vicarage at St Mary's to prepare the house for a new Christian community of four self-supporting adults. They will live there for a year and work locally.

#### What will Mary's House offer?

It will offer a lifestyle grounded in contemplative prayer and a Christian commitment to the environment. As a community, their shared life will be marked by a daily pattern of prayer, weekly work in the local community, and a rule of life with shared values and approaches to missional living.

#### Why Frome?

The combination of St Mary's site, the congregation's missional outlook, and the pioneering work at The Giant's Garden presents a compelling opportunity to explore and potentially establish a new Christian community here.

# What's the local reaction to the new community?

Frome is open to the spiritual side of life, there is a common concern for those on the edge of society and we hope that those who choose to live here will be able to connect with that aspect of life here. Mary's House offers an opportunity to show that you can live out in the world and live in a Christian community with a rhythm of prayer and rule of life; that it is possible to do the two together.

# What's your hope for the community?

That this community will contribute to God's work of regeneration in the churches and the town, increasing the missional impact of God's people. Long term it could develop a model that could be replicated elsewhere in the diocese.

The community will include a dispersed element of people living in their own homes but following a similar rule of life.

#### When do you expect to open?

We hope those called to help establish the residential expression of the community will move into Mary's House from September onwards.

### Ukraine: Conflict in Context An illustrated presentation

The war in Ukraine has now been underway for two years and there is no end in sight. Due to the complex origins, the shifting cast of players and the nature of the fighting, this is 'a different kind of war' to what had been expected.

Marcello Fantoni is a historian of the area and is doing his Doctorate on the peoples of southern Russia, especially the Cossacks. He has spent considerable time in the war zone and was indeed in Ukraine on the day Russia invaded.

The insights he has brought back are surprisingly different from those found in the mainstream media. Based on his own experiences and on-the-ground research, this illustrated lecture will provide a picture of what is happening now, and may happen in the future. It will simultaneously shock and enlighten.

### St George, Patron Saint of England

The English have a patron saint who isn't English, about whom next to nothing is known for sure, and who, just possibly, may not have existed at all. But that didn't stop St George being patriotically invoked in many battles, notably at Agincourt and in the Crusades, and of course it is his cross that adorns the flags of English football fans to this day.

It's most likely that St George was a soldier, a Christian who was martyred for his faith somewhere in Palestine, possibly at Lydda, in the early fourth century. At some point in the early centuries of the Church he became associated with wider military concerns, being regarded as the patron saint of the Byzantine armies. There is no doubt that St George was held as an example of a 'godly soldier', one who served Christ as bravely and truly as he served his king and country.

The story of George and the dragon is of much later date and no one seems to know where it comes from. By the Middle Ages, when George was being honoured in stained glass, the dragon had become an invaluable and invariable visual element, so that for most people the two are inseparable. However, it's probably more profitable to concentrate on his role as a man who witnessed to his faith in the difficult setting of military service, and in the end was martyred for his faithfulness to Christ.

The idea of the 'Christian soldier' was, of course, much loved by the Victorian hymnwriters - 'Onward, Christian soldiers!' The soldier needs discipline. The heart of his commitment is to obedience. The battle cannot be avoided nor the enemy fights appeased. He marches and alongside others, and he is loyal to his comrades. In the end, if the battle is won, he receives the garlands of victory, the final reward of those who overcome evil.

St George's Day (April 23<sup>rd</sup>) presents an opportunity to celebrate the ideal of the 'Christian soldier' – one who submits to discipline, sets out to obey God truly, does not avoid the inevitable battle with all that is unjust, wrong and hateful in our world, and marches alongside others fighting the same noble cause.

Discipline, obedience, courage, fellowship and loyalty – they're not the most popular virtues today, but that doesn't mean that they don't deserve our admiration.

200 years ago, on 19<sup>th</sup> April 1824, Lord Byron died. One of the greatest British poets and a leading figure in the Romantic movement, he died of sepsis/fever while fighting for Greek independence from the Ottoman Empire. Aged 36.

175 years ago, on 10<sup>th</sup> April 1849, American mechanic Walter Hunt was granted a US patent for his invention of the safety pin. He sold the rights for \$400, which is about \$12,000 today. The company he sold it to made millions from it.

90 years ago, on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1934, British inventor Percy Shaw patented the Cat's Eye reflective road stud. He set up a company to manufacture them and in 1937 he was awarded a government contract to mass produce them for national use.

75 years ago, on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1949, the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) was founded.




